





Should we become an NAMGBR affiliate?

At a meeting John Schwem mentioned that the 2018 NAMGBR meeting was going to be held in Gettysburg and he was going to attend. After a bit of discussion about it I spent a bit of time on the net investigating it and finding out what NAMGBR was. I had remembered that one of our past members – Gary Sandusky – had talked about it at a club meeting many years ago and the idea was pretty shot down. Back then I was not aware of NAMGBR.

I found out that NAMGBR was short hand for "North American MG B Register". Very similar to the way our club is named the MG Car Club Western New York Centre we welcome all sports cars – not just MG's. NAMGBR has opened up their registry to Midgets, 1100/1300s and post 1980 Mgs like the RV8, MGF, MGTF and MGC. Thier purpos is to maintain and expand the interest in Britian's most popular sports car – the MG.

NAMGBR also gained approval and support of the MG Car Club of england – our parent organization and is the only officially sanctioned MGB organization in the U.S., Mexico and Canada. I was not aware of this until Brian Woodhams, the representative from MG Car Club of England that is scheduled to speak at our 60th, spoke at the 2018 Gettysburg NAMGBR gathering.

While at the Gettysburg gathering (over 400 MGB's and other MG's – look for an article from John Baum whom also attended for more detail) I talked with a few different people about their club. I found out that to become an affiliate we only had to have 8 NAMGBR members in our club. Because John and I had joined when we decided to attend the meeting I new our club had at least two. John Schwem would be 3, then I remembered others in the club at one time or another mentioning they were members – Mike Robinson, Dick Powers, Mike & Sue Harrison, Rod Rodman and Dave Chase – heck that's 8, there must be a few others. I've since found out there are more than a dozen.

But what are the benefits? Why would we want to be an affiliate?

There are few but first the biggest one for the club – insurance. We currently pay just over \$700 per year for our insurance from J.C. Taylor. As an affiliate of NAMGBR we would be covered under their insurance – provided by – guess who – J.C. Taylor. And it's a better policy.

Next there is the directory – like our club has a list of members you can contact for help or information they have a directory – only difference theirs is North American wide – not just western New York.

An individual membership is \$30 per year. With your membership you get bi-monthly edition of the MG Driver magazine, special dash plaque for your can and information about the NAMGBR membership activities – annual convention, local affiliate club events and even a window decal.

So as was brought up at the last meeting when the discussion started about being an affiliate of NAMGBR – what's the catch? There's always a catch. You don't get something for nothing and I agree. BUT sometime the catch is well worth while and this is the case here. Here are the "Catches" - all something I think we can well afford -

- 1. We don't have to pay \$700 for insurance it comes free with our affiliation.
- 2. Submit at least one article per year to the Editor of the MG Driver magazine.
- 3. Submit an Annual Statement/Chapter Reaffirmation updating our club's officers, address, etc.
- 4. Use the Register logo on our local newsletter and publication.
- 5. promote the North American MGB Register to our membership and encourage to join. PLEASE NOTE it says promote and encourage not that they have to.
- 6. Have a minimum of 8 NAMGBR members on our rolls.
- 7. Mail or email copies of our newsletter to MG Driver Magazine Editor and Vice Chairman.

So thinking about this I see what they get is an influential advertisement to MG owners to also join their club. You may think that's not much – but while we struggle to keep our membership numbers up they have over 100 affiliate clubs. Their full financial report is available on their website.

I am proposing that we become an affiliate. It would in no way interfere with our membership with the MG Car Club of England – but it would save us over \$700 per year. And a side benefit would be more MG owners would become aware of our club and possible join us.

If we could make this happen soon we could advertise our 60th Anniversary Celebration in the MG Driver Magazine – possible get some attendance from NAMGBR members.

How Long Did it Run?? - Car Show 2018

Well another car show has come and gone, and this is the 6th year that Wilbert's Inc, and Wilbert's U-Pull-It has contributed a unique attraction to our show. The concept is simple: get a car that still runs, empty the fluids, sell tickets for time slot guesses at "how long will it run?" and split the pot 50/50 between the closest time slot holder and the club. I can't take credit for the concept, that credit goes to Leon Zak. But 6 years ago, I volunteered to handle the attraction and now it seems to be nearly a fixture at the show. This year Tyler Petrie from Wilbert's called me to let me know that they had identified a car for this year's show. Wilbert's technicians drained the oil and the antifreeze at their yard, loaded the car on a flatbed and dropped it at the Elk's club for our show. We positioned the car near our tent and put up the Wilbert's U-Pull-It banners. This year we had some nice Wilbert's brochures to hand out in our registration bags as well as having some at the "How long will it run?" table. This year's Car was a 2002 Saturn with a 1.9 liter, 4 cylinder engine. It had 227,083 miles on the odometer and everyone thought this engine is so worn and loose, it might run for a good long time. Our "How long will it run?" board holds the opportunity for 1 hour's worth of guesses in 15 second interval's, a total 240 possible blocks, and if it runs for more than an hour, your block is good again in the second hour, the third hour and so on.

In previous years we had some spectacular runs including a Buick Park Avenue that ran for over 2 hours and a couple of Chrysler products that just chugged along getting hotter and hotter while sending up smoke signals until they died at 24 and 32 minutes. But not this year. The weather was ex-

tremely hot. There was no breeze to speak of. The Weather service had issued an extreme heat warning. With 105 of the blocks purchased for \$2.00 each, we started the car at just after noon. It seemed like no time at all until the car just stopped. It didn't smoke, it didn't chug, it didn't clatter, it just stopped at 5 minutes and 17 seconds. And it had 3 gallons of fuel in the tank! So, was it the heat? Or was it the electronics in the Saturn Engine that said, "hold on, let's shut down and save this engine?" Well whatever happened, rules are rules, and Natalie walked away with \$105, and \$105 was turned over to our treasurer.

Since you are reading this, you either have a vintage car or have an interest in a vintage car. If you or anyone you know is heading out to Wilbert's "U-Pull-It", please let them know how much the club appreciates their unique contribution to our car show. And thank you to anyone that participated in "How long will it Run?" by buying a square on our board.

Our Trip to NAMGBR 2018

After having owned our MGB for more than 20 years, I realized what was missing is a membership to NAMBGR.Looking into it, we realized the Gettysburg National Convention of MGB owners would be fun.

Chris and I left on Sunday the 16th of June and drove all back roads to Gettysburg. The drive was great, spent all day driving rural roads, and although we did not get far, we did find an interesting Bed and Breakfast near State College PA. 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
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
