For those that were not able to attend the meeting in May, a discussion regarding the Spokes was brought up in New Business, and I want to share the gist of it here. The cost of publishing the Spokes every month is roughly \$280.00, or \$3360 a year. This covers printing costs and postage, it does not cover the cost of printing and stuffing the envelopes and delivering them to the PO. Those costs are absorbed by John as a monthly donation to the club and would otherwise add a significant amount to the final cost. The Board discussed this at our Board meeting and came up with ideas for a few different options. They are, make it a bi-monthly, make it a quarterly magazine, or a combination of either of the first two with a monthly single page newsletter. All of these would cut the publishing costs by at least half, and perhaps deliver a publication with a larger format (full 8.5 x 11 rather than the 5.5 x 8.5 it is currently) and perhaps a color cover. We are investigating the options and will present our decision at the July meeting after the July board meeting. If you would have any ideas or suggestions please let me or any other Board member aware of them, or feel free to attend the July Board meeting and present them yourself. We do know this much, the Spokes is an important and integral part of the club, and it needs to remain such. For those unable to make every meeting or event, it's an important part of being a member and feeling like they belong to an organization. Be assured the Spokes will remain, although perhaps in a different format than what we have become accustomed to.

Saturday June 30th

The plans for the Poker Run and Steak Roast are coming together. Chris and I have taken a trial run on an interesting route. We will be meeting at the parking lot behind the **Scottsville Post Office at 11:00 AM**, with the **first car off at 11:30 AM**. The expected drive time is two and half hours and will end at the park where we will be hosting the Steak Roast.

The route we chose is primarily scenic back roads within the east side of Monroe County. It is an opportunity to drive your car on a summer day with your car club friends. This Poker Run is not a timed event, however in case of a tie the winner will be determined by who comes in closest to two and a half hours. The timing is designed by use of posted speed limits.

The Poker Run rules are simple. When we leave the starting point, each car will get one playing card and directions. Car Show History

Well, it's definitely just around the corner. Yes,that's right. Time has flown by and next month the Car Club's Sports Car Festival is going to happen. For those of you that are not familiar with the Festival I thought I'd take this opportunity to fill you in on how this Car Show /Festival evolved.

The father of the Show was Dave Wild along withsome others who decided that a car show was just the ticket and an excuse to spend a whole day talking about the cars they love. It was held at Dave's farm and was called the Wagon Jack Car Meet. The first Show was held in October 1969 and was home for the Show for three years. I never attended those Shows but I have been to Dave's farm and I can imagine it must have been a great time.

The Western New York MG Car Club Show first appeared on the scene on the first Sunday in June 1972. With the help of the Victor Lyons Club, as a co-Sponsor, the Show moved to Victor High School. It took off like a rocket. I attended these shows and it was truly the largest one-day car show in this area and maybe even the eastern part of the country. At it's peak the Show boasted better then 96 classes and one year had 1200 entrants. It took the whole club with the help of the Lyons to make it happen. It was a great opportunity to have numerous organizational "get-togethers" and a unique tradition was to sacrifice a chicken before the Show to guarantee good weather and fair skies for the day of Show. I think the chicken was really morefigurative and I don't know who concocted this attempt to influence Mother Nature, but it did work sort of, well maybe.

The Show's next stop was Fingerlakes Race Track and times were changing. The Lyons were beginning to have fewer and fewer members participate. The Show, however, stayed at the Racetrack for the next 4, maybe 5 years still

boasting 900 to 1000 entrants, depending on the weather, and was still the best one-day show in the area. Eventually, theRacetrack decided to use its parking lots for bettors and patrons so the Show moved again.

The next move took us to Farmington Park in Fairport. We had a smaller space and fewer entrants, but still had a great time. We stayed at the Park for 3 or 4 years and found the Park wasn't the best place for a car show. The Show then took a year off to regroup and readjust to the times that were continuing to change.

It was Leon Zak who stepped forward and moved the Show to its current location on Jackson Road in Webster. The Show has trimmed down and lost its first Sunday in June date, but it remains a great show and a bunch of fun.

In the past 48 years thousands of carshave competed and thousands of spectators have been entertained at the Western New York MG Car Show/Festival. We want to keep Dave's great idea going strong, but that can't happen without the participation of the club members by volunteering your time and more importantly bringing your car to the show. The Car Show for years has been the focal point of the club's activities. We need to keep it alive, and with each and everyone's help we can do it.




