I hope you're all enjoying Summer in your own way, driving your cars and enjoying the company of friends. What could be better?



Sunday June 5<sup>th</sup> (which normally would have been the date of our annual Sports Car and Vintage AutoFestival) a group of members from the MGCC and Victor Lions Club met for Brunch at Brenda's in Victor. It was to thank Brenda's for their publicity of our show in the past and also to bring some business in, on a day that would have seen much more if there had been a car show. I hope this wasn't an omen of the coming season as it was a nice day and we had a good time together but it was <a href="#HOT!!">HOT!!!</a> We didn't travel with the rest of the group to Chris and Eileen's but rather were to go to a concert for our grandson. Little did we realize that this would be the omen of things to come the following week.

On Friday June 10<sup>th</sup> a group of MGCC members made the yearly trek to the big car show at Hildene in Manchester VT. This was our 10<sup>th</sup> time there and we always have a real good time. It is a fantastic show and gets bigger every year. This year was no exception to the rule and we heard that they had over 900 cars on the field. But more on that later.

After last year we decided to break up into groups of no more than four cars to travel together. It is much easier keeping track of four cars than it is of eight or more. Our group consisted of Nancy and I leading in the B, Doug and Cindy Jack in their TR3, Gil and Betty in the TD and Gene and Anne Faust in their Chrysler (Sebring) MG. We left the house at about 9 and took off for our first leg. Our drive to Baldwinsville was nice but uneventful. After a short stop it was off on the second leg. Every thing was fine and it was a nice warm day. We got to the turn off for Rome and proceeded, noticing that it was getting a little warm. By the time we passed Rome and were heading for Utica it was really getting warm. We decided to stop at Utica for lunch seeing as it was nearing 12 noon. It was really hot when we got out of the cars and we welcomed the air conditioning inside the restaurant. Leaving there after lunch we continued on still traveling in very hot weather. When we got to Herkimer the time temperature clock was reading 97 degrees! It was HOT.

By the time we got to Johnstown it had cooled off considerably and there the temperature was only 93. Time for the sweaters? From there it was through Saratoga, Schylerville, Greenwich, Cambridge and finally into East Arlington and we were in Vermont. Another short hop and we were at the Chalet Motel and really welcomed the air conditioning. It had been a hot drive but the cars (all of them) performed admirably and no car overheated. That's more than I can say for their human passengers. We were whooped. It was a long hot drive.

Saturday morning we were up early and off to Mount Equinox for the VSCCA Annual Hill Climb. This has been

another yearly ritual and it is fascinating seeing the cars that people are running up that mountain. There are runs in the morning and then when all the cars are at the top, they bring them down and do the same things all afternoon. Interesting and rare cars always and this year was no exception. The blue Bugatti Type 35 was there again as well as a number of Allards, Bentleys, Porsches, a TC an A, and the Amilcar that won the Round The Houses Race at Alexandria Bay in 1938. Great day and great fun watching them fly up that hill. The Bugatti has the **loooooongest** first gear I have ever heard.

After lunch it was off to the show field. We found our designated spot and settled in for the afternoon. (we thought) It was an absolutely beautiful Vermont summer day with not a cloud in the sky and extremely high temperatures and **NO BREEZE** at all. We lasted for part of the afternoon but it was so hot we opted to go back to the motel for some cooling air conditioning.

The following day we were at the field again and it was overcast so the heat wasn't so bad. Lucky for all of us Doug and Cindy had the foresight to bring along a pop up canopy and we all took shelter under it. When the trophies were awarded we stayed to see who had won in our class (Dave Chase and Dick and Marlene Rzepkowski) and then took off for some shopping. Had dinner that night with Doug and Cindy and retired early. The following morning we had decided to leave by about 9:00 so we could be in Saratoga at The Saratoga Auto Museum for their opening at 10:00. The current exhibit features Bugatti's and it was worth every penny of the admission charge. Where else will you see 10 perfectly restored Bugatti's all under one roof. Eight of the 10 cars are owned by one couple and the most rare was a Bugatti Atlantic Coupe. This car is one of three built and only one of two that remain. The sister car is owned by Ralph Lauren. This car took a best in show at Pebble Beach and one can see why. It is an absolutely flawless restoration done in a beautiful shade of light sliver blue. (Bugatti's were always painted blue as that is the national racing color of France) I can't even begin to think of owning such a car and then, loan it out to a museum for a display? If it were mine I would have it under armed guard 24 hours a day. I would urge any one that can, to visit Saratoga and take in this exhibit. It is a once in a lifetime chance to see this many rare and beautifully restored cars under one roof.

From there we left and headed for home. We stopped in Johnstown for lunch and found the time temperature clock once again in the 90's and figured it must be stuck. But when we got to Herkimer again the clock there was reading 100!!! Utica was next and we decided it was time

to get a cold drink. From there it was uneventful and one more stop in Baldwinsville and home we came. We ran into some rain around Cato and Meridian but by the time we got to Route 104 it had stopped and the sun came out again. Still hot though. We got home with no more rain but Gil and Betty did get some before they got to Pitts-All in all it was a great weekend. The show at Hildene gets better every year and the cars are magnificent. There is a couple from Massachusetts that owns a "fleet" of restored vintage Chryslers and it is fun to see which car they will bring every year. This year was no exception and the chosen car for their travels was a BIG 1933 Chrysler Le Baron Phaeton. It was done in two shades of gray (medium and dark) with a burgundy accent stripe, while the interior was also burgundy and the top was back. It was gorgeous but the best part is, they drive every one of their cars to the show. They're great people and we look forward to seeing what they will bring every year. We have never been disappointed. She told me once they have at least 10 of these cars and they enjoy using them. Another interesting car on the other end of the size scale was an Austin Healey Sprite (MK II) that had a Jaguar (straight six) engine installed. It was not quite finished as it had no bonnet and the front fenders were not painted vet but the rest of the car from the windscreen back was finished, and beautifully done. But the engine installation was by far the neatest "swap" I have ever seen and looked like it had been done by the factory. Everything was meticulous and when he started it up the sound was enough to make a grown man cry. This car snarled. I would love to be able to drive that car sometime as it had to be blindingly fast.

So there you have our little journal. 627 miles (on our car) and we all got home safe and sound and all the cars performed beautifully. No problems from any of them. We already booked our room for next year and will be back again. I have to see what that (Chrysler) couple will bring to the show. We have never been disappointed by their choice and it is a pleasure to see them every year.

If you have never been to Hildene in the spring I can't urge you enough to try it sometime. **BUT** if you do plan to go, make some reservations or inquiries now. Things usually book a year in advance. If you can get a room I'm sure you would enjoy the show. It's a fun weekend in a beautiful setting and there are cars you will not see many other places. This year was an exception with the heat, and I can never remember it being that hot. Usually there is a breeze blowing across the meadow but this year I think it was on vacation. We got lucky again with no rain at the field (other than three drops I think on Sunday afternoon) and the rain on the drive home was our free car wash. So everything worked out a lright and again I urge everyone if you've never been, you should make an effort to attend.

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
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
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
