

Famed Author Karl Ludvigsen Started in an MG



On April 13, more than 100 people attended a presentation at the International Motor Racing Research Center in Watkins Glen, by famed motorsports author Karl Ludvigsen. Among them, were 9 from our WNYMGCC and all enjoyed his presentation titled: "My Motoring Lifetime". Ludvigsen was the editor of Auto Age, Sports Cars Illustrated.



Car and Driver and east coast editor of Motor Trend. He currently writes for Automobile Quarterly, The Automobile and Hemings Sports and Classics. He's authored nearly 50 books including works about drivers Stirling Moss, Jackie Stewart, Juan Fangio and Bruce McLaren among others and about cars like Mercedes, Porsche, Corvette, Ferrari, Corvair and MG. In the Complete MG Guide, there's a photo of him at the wheel of his TC, racing at the old Thompson Raceway.

Ludvigsen was born in Kalamazoo, Michigan and now lives in Suffolk, England. He's world renowned for his automotive expertise and he started racing in an MG.





GOF, North Conway, New Hampshire

On June 5th Betty & I drove our MINI to North Conway, New Hampshire to attend the New England MG 'T' Register's Gathering of the Faithful –GOF. It was different for us.

We normally drive our MG TD. This time I just didn't have the confidence in the car for that long a trip. So we motored along, on cruise control with the AC on & arrived, cool & refreshed, at the hotel.

Thursday there were two seminars to attend. One was by Rudy Kruger on the Mount Washington Auto Road. He has driven his TD up the road twice, successfully, so he was qualified to give some pointers. He also gave an interesting history of the road. He showed a video, which I believe is on Utube, of a rally driver driving a prepared Subaru WRX up the road in 6+ minutes. It normally takes about a half an hour. Quite a thrill!

The second seminar was on valve cover racing. The Register has not had a set of rules

& regulations even though it has had a few "unofficial" races at other gatherings. Hal Kramer has been researching this event & contacted several clubs, including ours, for input. This seminar was to present a proposed plan for the Register & to get our input.

He did a good job & got lots of comments. Most people view the racer as a valve cover from a four cylinder engine with four wheels, one at each corner, like a car. Two guys from Ohio have "unconventional" configurations, one wheel forward, one wheel at the back & a wheel on each side. They also use 6 cylinder covers & weigh 28 pounds or more. The consensus was lighter, like 12 pounds & only four cyl. covers. Track configuration was also discussed.

Later that afternoon, Gene & Anne Faust & their son Doug arrived. Doug towed their TD in his trailer. That evening, Gene, Anne, Doug, Betty & I joined several other members in the lounge to honor Martin & Janet Schorer, who have attended every GOF but one. It was a good time with good food & lots of reminiscing about the good old days.

That night a valve cover race was held in the ball-room of the hotel. Ski & Tim Raymond built a track with about a 16 foot slope & 20 foot runoff. It had sides & a center divider. Release was by a lever operated pin. Betty & I took our racers. Gene Faust also brought his & there were several more, including the "heavys" from Ohio. The heats were run & it got down to Gene with his "conventional" racer & a guy from Ohio with his 28 pound 6 cylinder monster. The first run Gene was ahead when the monster hit his & broke a wheel. Fortunately, Gene had a spare & got back in but ended up second place to size & weight.

Friday it was raining! Fortunately the hotel had set up a huge tent in the parking lot. There were over 30 MG's & they all easily fit under that big top. A covered bridge tour was planned for the morning to end up at the Mount Washington Auto Road. Lunch could be had there & after that we could drive our car up the road to the top of the mountain. Well, we missed the tour because it started at 9:00 & we couldn't make it. It turned out we misread the instructions. We could have started any time after 9:00. Anyway it was raining. We decided to do some shopping & go to a model train museum which we have missed on previous trips. For those who did the tour, the mountain road was closed due to ICE! You could drive part way up but that was it. The cog railway was closed. The mountain was closed! So much for Friday's activities.

Friday night was a delicious Italian buffet & a Chinese auction. The auction was held similar to our basket auction. We bought tickets & put them in buckets in front of the items we wanted. I don't normally win anything but this time I got two items, all tools!

Like I need more tools, but it's always nice to have a spare. There was a beautiful Teapot basket but Betty didn't get that.




