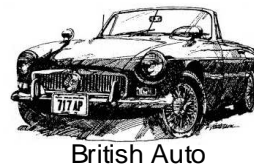

. Cost is only \$25.00 per car.

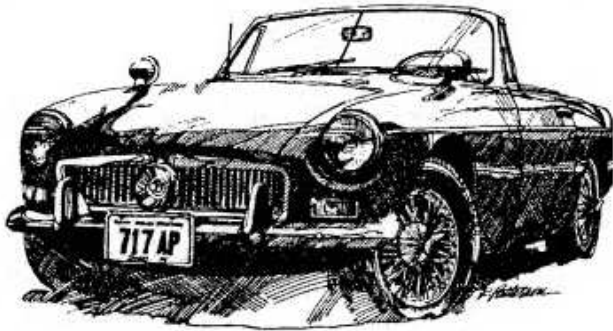

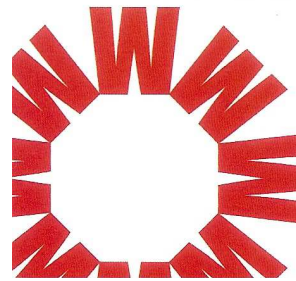

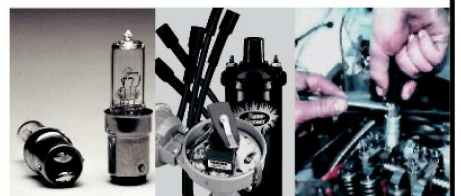
