



#### PARTNERS IN GRIME 7 THE AUSTIN TD - A HAPPY RESTORATION

Bruce & Cindy Austin were early, active members of the club. They were always there with their blue TD & smiles on their faces, ready for anything. I don't exactly remember when they joined, but I certainly remember them. At some point they moved into an old house in Wayne County. They had us out there for a few events but gradually their activity in the club waned until they were no longer members. Fast forward a few years. They moved to Fairport. We saw them now & then. Then they rejoined the club. It was like they never left. They became active again but the blue TD wasn't with them. Cindy had a neat blue & white Mini Cooper with a British flag painted on top.

One day Bruce came up to George & I & asked if we would be interested in restoring the TD. Way back when, he & his dad had restored it, doing all the work themselves. They drove it for a lot of years & then put it away. Bruce's dad had passed away, Bruce had gotten a little older (haven't we all?) & didn't feel like he had another restoration in him. Since we hadn't lined up a project for the winter yet, we agreed to take it on. He had it stored in his large (the size we all wished we had) garage along with Cindy's Mini & several motorcycles. Did I mention Bruce was also a motorcycle enthusiast & collector?

Anyway, we got it out & down to George's garage. The three of us discussed what was to be done. Bruce wanted to be very much involved. He had already decided the car would be green this time instead of blue. It would have a green interior & the top would be tan.

I've described in detail in past articles what is entailed in doing a restoration. First the car has to be disassembled. Then we assess what is needed. We asked Paul Winslow to do the painting & he agreed. Bruce & Cindy worked directly with him to determine the color green they wanted the car to be painted. We put together a list of parts thatwere needed from Moss Motors, trying to time the order to take advantage of sales. Bruce was at the garage most every day that we were working & took part in our planning. He also did some of the work along the way. He is such an upbeat guy & brought lots of levity to the job. Hence I call it a happy restoration.

The usual work was needed as we progressed. We did some body work before it went to Paul. We stripped & repainted the frame & it's components & reassembled it. Bruce bought some new tires to go on the powder coated wheels. We rebuilt the engine, it was tired but not bad. The rest of the running gear was OK. We just cleaned it & painted it. By the time

we got the rolling chassis ready the body was ready to come back from Paul's. Transporting work in the winter is always a worry because of the weather. This time things worked out. Paul was able to bring the body to us in his truck on a fairly decent day. We mounted the body to the frame. Bruce had refinished a special wooden platform that goes behind the seat. His Dad had made it to replace the original 3 piece plywood platform. It was a beautiful enhancement that Bruce was very proud of. The doors never fit very well in the past so it was my task to get them fitting & working properly. I'm proud to say that I have been able to do this on all the cars we have done. Bruce also wanted a wood rimmed steering wheel. I know how he feels, I have one. But, he didn't want one like mine. He wanted a four spoked wheel with a beautiful, highly polished, rich wood finish. \$\$\$\$ but to him it was worth it. Yes. Bruce had some definite ideas about what he wanted, but who's got a better right? The car came out magnificent! But that wasn't the end. He had seen wire wheels on a TD & thought they looked great. He did some research & bought a period correct set from England, complete with adapters, to be bolted on the wheel studs. He then bought another set of tires to be mounted on these wheels. It really made a striking difference in the car's appearance! Bruce also wanted a stop light mounted high above the spare wheel for safety. He searched the suppliers until he found one that looked just right. Then he had a bracket made to fit on the spare wheel carrier that held it at just the correct height. Perfect!

This was a beautiful MG TD if I do say so myself. Bruce entered it in the "U.K. Car Day". It was awarded the "Mark Voelkers Award for Craftsmanship" as selected by Wendell Castle. It was a proud day for Bruce, but also for George & I. Bruce had special plaques made up with bronzed model MG TDs on them & saying they were from his car.& presented one to each of us. These mean so much to George & me!




