

Last September 9-11 was the Vintage Race weekend at the Glen. This year we even had a race at the newly paved Glen track to go along with the Friday Downtown Fest. Many in our club helped with the event, showed cars and raced during what was a lovely summer weekend.

The Friday Concours was again chaired by **Dave Wild** and **Jeff Kath** with assistance from **Rob Shrader**, **Tony** and **Eileen Makepeace**, **Hollis** and **Doreena Hames**, **Barb Wild**, **Sue Kath**, Virginia Waytena, **Aldis** and **Janette Lemisis** (all the way from Florida) and **Bethel** and myself. It was nice to see **George Herschell** with his son **Jim** and grandson **Alex** there too.

From our club, those showing cars in the Concours were **Arnold** and **Stacey Van Denburgh** with their supercharged '62 TR-4, **Tim Paul** and son **Sam** with their'60 VW Beatle and **John** and **Dan Suter** with their newly acquired'55 MG ZA Magnette. On the grass, as you enter the Concours, was the MGBGT V8 of **Michael Claprood** and the **Powers**' Alfa Sprint.

Best of Show was a 1967 Ferrari GTB and Second place was a1967 Corvette. Corvette was the Featured Marque at the Glen this year and the idea for the Corvette was originally conceived at the Glen in 1951 by Harley Earl, then Head of Design for GM. Most Popular was the '60 VW of our own Tim Paul. Congratulations Tim!!

At the track, club members racing were **Ted Hershey** and **Dick Rzepkowski**, both in Midgets, **Al Costich** in an MGB GT, **John MacDonald** in a "Bugeye" Healey Sprite and **Dick Giambra** in an Alfa Romeo GTV. **Jim Acqulino**, also from our area, was there racing an MGB roadster.

In his Sunday race, **John MacDonald** won another Gold Medallion for finishing 1st in the HP class. Congratulations John!

The weather was generally good for racing but with a little rain, the great equalizer, for some sessions. The Collier Cup race, for all MGs, was scheduled just before lunch on Sunday. All our MGCC racers made the grid along with many of the usual MGs we see at the Glen. But there was one MG that has never raced at the Glen Vintage before. That was the 62 MGA driven by Kent Prather. I got to know Kent many years ago and even stayed at his farm in Kansas on one of my trips to visit Rachel in Denver. While there, I saw his large race shop and extensive collection of *go fast*

parts. In Vintage Racing, all of the really fast MGAs have Prather motors. Kent's MGA is a true SCCA racer and he's been SCCA National champ 6 times. That said, his car may look like an MGA and have a 1622 motor, but that's about where the resemblance ends.

Kent was gridded 2nd, sandwiched between 2 Midgets. A little further down the grid were the Midgets of Rzepkowski and Hershey, then the Costich BGT and a little further back, the B of

Acquilino. 24 MGs started the race and by the first lap, the Prather MGA was in front and held about a 4 car length lead for the rest of the race. In all the years I've been going to Vintage Races and during the 20 years I raced my MGA, I can't remember an MGA being first overall in the Vintage Collier Cup race. Yes, I did enjoy that very much, even if it was a trick SCCA MGA.

Ted and Al finished 11th and 12th and Jim finished 15th. Unfortunately, Dick had suspension trouble and after 2 laps spent the rest of the race parked in the Boot.

For finishing 1st overall, Kent received the Denver Cornett Jr. trophy and also the NAMGAR Bucher-Decker trophy, for being the first MGA across the line. The John Target 612 trophy, for the first 4 cylinder MGB, went to Gary Johnson and the Jack Archibald T-Cup, for the first T series MG to cross the line went to Steve Konsin. He also was awarded the Collier Cup by vote of all the other MG racers at the Glen. The trophy those of us in the Western NY Centre are most interested in, is the Bill Glanville Memorial **Cup**. This trophy is given by our MG Centre to honor the memory of our past member and racer, Bill Glanville. It is given to the first MG Midget to cross the line. Suzanne, Tom and Dan Glanville were there to award the trophy to a very deserving Peter Uzdavinis who had a race long battle with another Midge racer. Harry Gentry.

On a personal note, the Powers' 44th Anniversary was the Friday of Vintage weekend. Thanks to Dave and Barb Wild and my MGA racing friends from Virginia, Kevin Richards and Mike Eaton, for making our anniversary dinner a memorable occasion.

1955 MG ZA Magnette

This year, we suddenly have two new collector cars in the family. This month we'll describe our 1955 ZA Magnette. My Dad has had a strong interest in Magnettes for a number of years. To give you an idea, I brought him home a James Dugdale print of a Magnette at Silverstone-when I was in college in London -and which he still has! We've talked about finding a Magnette for years with no success. My interests in British saloons shifted to the Rover 3500S, including the one I had when living in England in 2000-01. However, when Dad moved from Tampa back to Rochester in 2014, we renewed our search for a Magnette. We joined the online North America ZMG group, who have been wonderful and have consistently shared great leads on cars for sale. We let a few slip by as they often included far distances and an undesirable amount of project work.

This past April we were alerted to a really attractive car on e***. Upon opening the listing, we saw it was an unusual cream and medium brown two-tone, and was a gorgeous older restoration fitted unexpectedly with chrome wire wheels. We wrote to the owner. learned it was located in Richmond, VA, got additional photos and information, and he shared that the car had significant NAMGAR history with the restorer owner who had the car from the mid '70s to 2014. Well, to me, this was like the line from the Jerry Maguire movie, "You had me at Hello". Bidding lastminute on a Sunday afternoon, we were the highest bidder but somehow did not clear the unknown reserve. We ended up coming to terms with the seller and suddenly we were making plans to fly down and rent a U-Haul truck and trailer. A pre-dawn flight to Dulles, rental mini-van, stop-n-go trip down Route 95, a crazy wait at a rural U-Haul shop while the owner tried to master the reservation computer, and finally we got to meet the gracious 83-year old owners who had bought the car from the estate of their friend.

The car turned out to be very good but not as spectacular as the photos (somehow this car photographs

amazing well), but we were still very pleased with it and completed the purchase. The rich wood dashboard with walnut veneer, attractive 2-tone interior, and classy appearance are some of my favorite features. We trailered it North that Friday evening, and trailered the remaining 10 uneventful hours on Saturday only to discover one of the bonnet pins had escaped along the way.

My continued research into the car's history showed that it was purchased around 1976 by Peggy Davis of Richmond as a young woman, when she was attending an MG event in the Poconos with her dad Carroll in his MG TD. Carroll also owned a TC, TF, and an Austin Taxi and had restored several of them. Carroll restored the Magnette for Peggy in a shiny brown caramel solid color. The chrome wires were added at this time. I got a chance to speak in detail with Peggy in May, and she described the restoration as a complete ground-up including dipping the body shell at a shop in Baltimore; her dad welding in new panels to remove any rust; and a full mechanical, trim, and paint restoration. The chrome remains beautiful to this day. Peggy said he had a parts car as well, which explains the presence of some ZB parts on this car, which initially had me scratching my head.

Another anomaly was that the VIN on the title had a TF- prefix rather than the needed KAA43- prefix shown on the data plate (but had the correct serial number as verified on the data plate and stamped into the body shell). I am convinced that the selling dealer (which was also surely selling MG TFs in much greater quantity, like 10:1, at the time) simply put the wrong prefix when filling out the paperwork, and nobody caught it in all those years! Our local DMV office helped me follow the needed steps to get the evidence submitted to correct the number. The prefix also shows this car started life as a black car, which was a common color on Magnettes.

Peggy started showing the car in concourse events in 1981. Her NAMGAR Registry number shows

it was only the 8th Variant registered with the club. She took First in Class at the national NAMGAR meet held in Harpers Ferry, WV. Two years later, she returned to the



NAMGAR national meet, this time in Cypress Gardens, FL, and took the Premier prize.

In those days, it was required that one retire a national show winner for 5 years following such a win, and Peggy lost interest in the car when she could no longer show it. She transferred it to Carroll who carefully stored and maintained it in dry indoor storage. In 1998 he repainted the car in its current color scheme. It is close to a ZB Varitone color pattern but not exactly. Also, the car lacks the larger wrap-around rear window arrangement that is also characteristic of a Varitone. Carroll drove the Magnette less and less as he became elderly and eventually it sat for a few years. Upon his death in 2014, his friends purchased the car, but by early this year also came to realize they were not using the car either.

A number of NAMGAR members have helped me locate great period photos of it at the NAMGAR shows, and also obtain the club magazine issues describing the 1981 (Class win) and 1983(Premier win) national events. I've been able to document the 1976 to present history quite well.

Upon getting the car home, we learned that the master cylinder required a full rebuild, and we went through fixing a number of small electrical problems. We also adjusted valves and carbs, replaced the flex brake lines (Scarborough Faire carries a few Magnette-specific parts!), replaced the battery, and purchased new tires through Doug Scribner that George Haynes mounted with new tubes. It turns out that this beautiful car with all these round shapes is *loaded* with sharp edges between bonnet and boot—be careful or pay the price when working on it!

After getting it roadworthy, we've enjoyed it all summer by taking it to car shows, cruise nights, the Waterloo Mac's Drive-In event with the club, and Watkins Glen vintage festival where we showed it for fun. Now we've got a few more small issues to fix for next season. This is going to sound silly, but I've gotten a real kick out of those bright, clear Sunday mornings when both the Magnette and my black MGA were shiny clean, and both idling in the driveway together with that characteristic MG B-series engine exhaust note, waiting to head out to a show.





An amazing number of people have come up to us to declare they never knew MG made such a sedan, or that they have never seen one in person before. It has

proven to be comfortable and a nice cruiser and it is a fun and unusual car to have !


