

BASKET AUCTION NEWS!!!


The Basket Auction Raffle will be one of the fun and exciting highlights of this years Car show(July 16th). We need your help to make it successful.


- * Go your own way or team up with a friend and choose a theme, then let us know by signing up at the April/May meeting.

Start up the Packard! NY to rehab FDR's ride

ALBANY - The 1932 Packard Phaeton driven by Franklin Roosevelt when he was governor has been on display behind a wall on the fourth floor of the State Museum in Albany, but largely out of public view. That may soon change. Gov. Andrew Cuomo watched workers on Tuesday pack up the Packard for repairs. The goal is to get it working again and take it on the road for state events — and maybe even the opening of the new Tappan Zee Bridge slated for 2018. "This is a national treasure, and it's going to be a great marketing device for the state of New York and the 'I Love NY' campaign," Cuomo, a car enthusiast, told reporters after inspecting the engine and sitting in the driver's seat. No cost estimate was provided for restoring the car to working order. "We're hoping to get it running. I'm hoping to get it running for the Tappan Zee Bridge opening, to tell you the truth. But it really is a beautiful piece of history." The model 905 was purchased in 1932 by the Hyde Park native for his use in Albany when he was governor. When he became president a year later, the 12-cylinder Packard joined the state fleet of vehicles, according to the State Museum. "Though kept in running condition, it was rarely used after 1942, when Gov. Thomas Dewey acquired a Cadillac," the museum said.

Gov. Hugh Carey transported Queen Beatrix and Prince Claus of the Netherlands in the Packard when they visited Albany in 1982, the museum said, but after that it wasn't really used much. Cuomo said it was last inspected in 1988 and has about 40,000 miles on it. "As a car, it is a really special car, just as a classic car," Cuomo said. "But a classic car that was FDR's — just imagine it."

U.S. Congress Introduces Bill to Prohibit E15 Sales

You may use the following points in your message:

- Ethanol can cause metal corrosion and dissolve certain plastics and rubbers, especially in older vehicles that were not constructed with ethanol-compatible materials.
- HR 1315 would eliminate the unrealistic mandates imposed under the RFS such as requiring refiners to blend 36 billion gallons of biofuels by 2022.
- HR 1315 would prohibit the sale of E15 gas in order to meet artificial RFS deadlines.
- HR 1315 would protect older vehicles from the risks posed by E15.

<u>Overview</u>: Legislation (HR 1315) has been introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives to prohibit the sale of E15 (gasoline that is 15% ethanol), capping the amount of ethanol that can be blended into conventional gasoline at 10%. The bill also eliminates the Renewable Fuel Standard's (RFS) mandate that requires 15 billion gallons of corn-based ethanol be blended into the U.S. fuel supply each year. Ethanol, especially in higher concentrations such as E15, can cause damage to older vehicles.
