





Watkins Glen Vintage GP Festival 2016 Glenkhana Report

This year marked my tenth year participating in the Watkins Glen Vintage GP Festival Glenkhana. I had watched as a spectator for several years before deciding I wanted in on the fun! The Glenkhana is a fun gymkhana event in a parking lot, where sports cars compete against each other and the clock by executing a course marked by cones, while participating in goofy displays such as stopping to trade places with the navigator, wearing silly outfits, singing songs or driving circles around a cone while holding on to a string taped to a golf ball sitting on top of the cone. All this is done at the Maguire Chrysler parking lot in downtown Watkins Glen, in front of hundreds of cheering spectators.

I often take my brother in law Dan Kester, or my Cousin Ted Weundsch as navigator. This year my navigator was long time friend John Feldman. John used to drag race Mopars and Chevy's in the 70's, and this was his first time at the Vintage GP festival. We were met in town by my cousin Ted, who is a regular at Glen races and has been my navigator before.

We start out with about 15 participating cars at breakfast Friday morning at Hector Winery, on the East side of Seneca Lake. We got our packets with window sticker, handouts, dash plaque and instructions. The cars included a couple of MGBs, MGA, a Spitfire, Fiero, a couple of Lotii, Minis both original and new, BMWs, Corvettes, a 56 T bird and a Model A ford! How did the Model A get in this? Hector Winery is one of the sponsors of the Glenkhana and the owner also participates with his Lotus. After breakfast we had a short drivers meeting, followed by an optional hour long rally through the winding roads around Watkins Glen, ending at the Maguire Chrysler parking lot right in the middle of Franklin Street in Watkins Glen. Maguire is the other Glenkhana sponsor and lets us use their lot for the event.


I usually forgo the rally, so that I have time to check out the other events and car exhibits in town, including the Concourse, Concorso Speciale (AKA LeMons) Cycle exhibit, Lotus and Ferrari displays. Along the way I enjoy meeting up with members of the MG Car Club there for the fun.

Then it's back to the Maguire lot for a quick picnic lunch before we stage for our two laps of the old street course. Each year the Glenkhana group runs laps with another group, sometimes the Concourse cars or another group, and this year it was with the Concorso Speciale cars. I had noticed a VW Micro bus in the group and he was having issues, also a Ford Model A roadster, so I didn't want to get behind them!

We were gridded on Franklin Street, and waited. Then the green flag and we were off on our two laps of the old course! As it turned out this was a spirited group and I had all I could do to keep the MGB up with the others up the big hill out of town and past the Seneca Lodge! Up the big hill, turn at the Seneca Lodge, turn again before the stone bridge, turn again, past the group of partiers in tents by the open field near the upper park entrance, slow for the railroad tracks then turn and down around big bend down hill before the tight left at Milliken's corner and right back on Franklin. Then down Franklin and past the waving and cheering crowd. Makes you feel like a real race driver! John liked that part besides gripping the windshield post with white knuckles. I told him how Milliken's corner got its name and he was glad we didn't try to reenact that! Do two laps and on the second lap after turning onto Franklin we get pointed into the Maguire lot to prep for our event!

For the Glekhana we get three tries and are timed while doing our course. The course is tight and confusing, and we walk it once before driving. I like to go near the front and first time I did OK and my navigator John encouraged me saying I was in with the faster cars so lets win this! Our silly stunt was to stop halfway and "decorate" our car with about 6 feet of tissue bunting. Not much to do there so after hanging it on the sun visors we were off and around the cones. On the second time we had to navigate the course with a big stuffed animal in the back on the rear scuttle. Around the cones our second try, I got off course and missed a cone after a really good time. All the while the announcer makes joking banter such as ... "go ahead and smoke the tires...if you can" and "is that MG leaking oil? Don't all MG's? On the third try we had to get out and sing a song, and I've already forgotten what song. It became clear a





young guy in an autocross prepped Mini cooper was the guy to beat and he was having a day of it! Meanwhile my cousin Ted had found a ride with a guy with a LT1 Corvette that hadn't brought a navigator. The Corvette was too big for the course but the crowds love it when they smoke the tires. The smaller cars were doing well, and turned out the VW micro bus was from our group and running again and was slowly plowing around the cones. My last Try was the best but we still weren't close to fastest so just parked and enjoyed watching the other cars complete the course. The prizes range from "most sedate" to "best costume" and finally overall "fastest" which went to the kids in the Mini. Best costume went to a couple in a Lotus dressed as hippies. Anyways we all got a bottle of wine courtesy of Hector Winery and parked our cars in the lot for display. The tape separating the parking lot from the crowd comes down and soon we're awash in a sea of people.

Then we ambled off through town to see the cars and catch a great burger and a beer at the Crooked Rooster. Up and down the street are parked the cars from the other rallys such as Knapp sporting roadsters, Founders tour, Glenora run, so we get to see many other club members with their cars kicking back and enjoying themselves. In the park are the tour de Marque Corvettes.

Just about the time we finished eating the race cars come down from the track and we have a great time of seeing all the cars and meeting all the drivers. Where else can you get so close to great racing machinery and mix and mingle with thousands of like minded enthusiasts! The race cars do their laps and were driving by just feet away separated by a few random hay bales. Then the racers depart and all too soon it gets dark. Later there are fireworks, but we decide to make a run for it and head back to Rochester. All in all a real great time and never disappoints! I'm ready for next year.

Ford Wins leMans in '66 and Bill Benet was There!

Last December 10th, MGCC members **Bill** and **Desi Benet**, **Dave Wild**, **Hollis Hames**, **Tony Makepeace**, **Jeff Kath**, **Bill and Cheryl Baldwin**, **Joe Tierno** and myself all attended the IMRRC program about Ford winning the 1966 Le Mans 24 hour race. That was the first overall win for an American car and Ford took the top 3 spots and won the next 3 years too. It was the Ford vs. Ferrari era and supposedly it all began when Ford tried to buy Ferrari and Enzo Ferrari backed out after long and expensive negotiations. That infuriated Henry Ford II so much that he decided to build a car that would beat Ferrari at Le Mans.




The car was actually built by Lola in England along with help from Ford US. It was called the Ford GT 40 because it raced in the GT class and was only 40" high. That was fine for most drivers, but when a tall Dan Gurney became one of the drivers, they had to put a clearance bubble in the roof so his helmet wouldn't hit.



The IMRRC program was done by Preston Lerner. He's a vintage racer and also the author of a very detailed book about Ford winning Le Mans. Along with the presentation, the IMRRC had a lovely black GT 40 on display. I'm sure most of us wanted to get in and drive it away.

After the presentation, we all went back to the IMRRC main building for a reception. While there, the discussion continued about the Ford win and when they found out that our **Bill Benet** was at that race, they asked him to tell us about his '66 Le Mans experience. As you would expect, Bill did a great job with just enough details about the race, the Carnival and drinking inexpensive French wine for 24 yours. Bill was in the seats across from the pits and after the Fords won, he got on the track and shook hands with Henry Ford II and congratulated him on the victory! Bill also showed us his souvenir French flag that flew over Le Mans during the race and then he gave it to the IMRRC for their archives.
