At the May meeting I did a presentation on a couple of points that needed to be brought to the membership for discussion. I know some were at Mosport and others were at Carlisle, so the following is an overview of the slide presentation I gave. If you have Power Point and would like to view it on your own, let me know and I can forward it to you.

Going into 2017 as the Chairman, my intended style of leadership was going to be laid back and not rock the boat, and that if things aren't broke, don't go fixing them. I had good reasons to adopt that attitude, as John and the previous board have done a great job of managing the club's finances and keeping the ship on a straight course. As a result I didn't see any need for any major changes. We have a healthy bank balance which allowed us to subsidize many events and give a good return back to the members. Our membership retention and growth was somewhat flat but nothing to cause concern, and the membership seemed relatively content, so I didn't see a need to make any changes to the status quo. January came and went and all was well. The club was on cruise control and everything was running smooth. Then February happened, and to quote Victor Borge "I got some good news, and I got some bad news".

First the bad news.

As Paul reported at the April meeting, we have had a significant drop in membership renewals. Roughly 50 people have not renewed this year, which results in a deficit of just a little over \$1500.00 from where we were at this time last year. The reasons for this drop is varied. Some have moved, some have sold their cars and are no longer active in the hobby, a large number were what I would call "lurkers". We reviewed the names at the board meeting and a good percentage of them were people I had not met or have seen at events. Unfortunately some have not renewed for health reasons, and others simply forgot – human nature.

The second bit of bad news is earlier this year in February I was presented with an increase in rent from the K of C to the tune of \$25.00 a month. This increased our monthly rent from \$75.00 to \$100, plus the \$30 dollar bar fee we pay each month brought our total monthly expenditure to \$130.00, an increase of \$300.00 annually.

Now the good news.

So far this year we have 20 NEW members. These are not renewals, but brand new members, so membership is off to a good start. If we can continue that trend through the rest of the year, some of the shortfall from last year will recover. Discussions are going on behind the scenes of ways to further increase membership through education at Cruise Nights and Car shows, so we believe in time this will resolve itself without too much intervention.

As far as the rent goes, frankly I can think of a lot of things we can do with that \$300 a year other than pay it out in extra rent. The K of C has been very good to us, and it's served its purpose well. In communications with the Manager he assured me they do not take rate increases lightly and only do so when the business dictates it. That is totally understandable, but it's still an expense that we have to try and manage, and we as the Board would not be doing our jobs if we didn't investigate other options, so perhaps it's time for a change.

Because the K of C was good enough to notify us in February, we had 5 months to look for another location before the rate increase took effect, so we didn't have to scramble to find a location at the last minute. We could be deliberate and logical in our search and make a decision based on facts and do what is right for the club as a whole. As a result, we as a board decided at the February board meeting to begin a preliminary search for a new location, and this new location had to meet certain criteria.

Capacity of up to 70 people

4

- Plenty of parking for our LBC's (fortunately we are not the Cadillac El Dorado Club of WNY)
- Easy access shouldn't need GPS, Trip-Tic or a Sherpa Guide to find the place.
- Centrally located (Henrietta, Pittsford, Brighton area)
- A bar, or the permission to BYOB if no bar present
- Good accessibility for those with physical limitations
- Cheaper rent. Preferably less than what we are paying now, and definitely less than what the new rate will be at the K of C

We brainstormed a list of locations that fit that geographic area, then narrowed it down based on the criteria. Initially we had five locations:







Three places were eventually decided on, as the Library and Burgundy Basin were eliminated for various criteria not being met, mainly parking and cost. These three locations are all in the Henrietta area.

The three locations chosen are:

- The Elks Club
- The Pavilion where we have our annual Valve Cover Races
- The American Legion

The Elks Club initially was open to meeting with the board to look over the facilities and responded to my initial email, but over a period of two weeks the facilities manager I was referred to never returned my emails or phone calls, and the Chairman also stopped responding. After 4 weeks of silence I got the hint.... See ya later 'tater.

While at the Valve Cover races the board members present looked over the facilities and we ultimately decided it was a bit too sparse, the seating was less than ideal, and also we would not be able to schedule meetings a year in advance to reserve evenings. Also picking up and dropping off the key for every meeting would be logistically difficult.

The America Legion met all of the requirements above, and then some. The Staff – Ralph and Al - were very responsive and very helpful. The inside of the meeting room was a bit "echo-y" with the hard surfaces, and the bar area is located downstairs, but that's about the only potential drawbacks we could see.

They can meet our capacity requirement, there is plenty of parking available with two lots, one to the north and one to the south, plus a semi-circle drive wide enough to park in. There is easy access being right off the Lehigh Station exit (in fact you can see it from 390 to the left as you're going south), it's

centrally located, has a bar, a handicap ramp, and they are offering to rent it to us for \$100 a month, a savings of 30 dollars a month after the rent increase, and \$5 dollars less than what we are currently paying. If you look on their website for room rental, their normal fee is \$175.00 plus a \$100 deposit for a cleanup fee. In fact the original rent they offered was \$115, but Ralph called me later on and dropped it to \$100, so we are getting a tremendous discount.

We had our May board meeting there to look the place over and we all came away satisfied it could meet our requirements, and there's also some added features. They have a very nice outdoor pavilion where we could host a picnic or simply have a meeting outdoors if it's a nice evening. They have a full kitchen that is open from 5 to 8 PM (it will close early on our meeting night) where you can get a bite to eat before the meeting if you wish, and the bar has some seriously cheap prices (\$1 dollar drafts on Thursday night, that got everyone's attention) In the meeting area there are enough round tables and chairs, a 65 inch flat screen TV for audio-visual, and a fireplace for those that would like to toast their buns during the meeting.

As I mentioned earlier, there are a couple of small drawbacks.

- The bar is located downstairs, and their liquor license would require us as guests to sign in before purchasing any beverages. Signing in is no biggie but the stairs could be an inconvenience. There is a small "portable bar" upstairs in the main meeting area that can be stocked before the meeting however, so the stairs can be avoided.
- The main meeting room is all hard surfaces and it can be a bit "echo-y", but Ralph is looking into having sound deadening installed to lessen it. He did say that once you have a room full of people that the echo drops significantly.

We can reserve our existing cadence of the third Thursday of each month except December. Ralph and Al were very gracious hosts and are eager to assist us in any way they can. They have other groups that meet there on a regular basis, and Thursday nights are wide open, so it's a good fit for us and for them.

They have offered for us to come there as a group for a tour of the facilities before any vote is taken, and that seemed to be well received at the meeting last night, so I will set a Thursday night between now and the June meeting and get back to the club with the date and time.

So what are the next steps you may be asking?

The board wanted to present this 30 days before any vote is taken to give you time to think about it or ask questions. We will vote on this at the June meeting. If you are unable to make the meeting we will work out a way to do absentee ballots via email so that everyone will have a chance to vote. If the measure passes, then the June meeting will be our last meeting at the Knights of Columbus, and our July meeting will be the first meeting at the American Legion.

I took some pictures at the May board meeting and I am presenting them here.

This is looking at the building from the south side. The main entrance is there in the front. On the north side of the building is another parking lot and there is an entrance ramp for those that don't do stairs very well. There is also ample parking in the circle drive to the left.



Another view of the south parking lot. The lot on the north side is just a bit bigger and there is overflow parking in a graveled area just behind.



This is the main meeting room. The front entrance is to the left out of the picture, and the entrance from the ramp is to the right, also just out of the picture.



The Main entrance from the front is behind Maggie and Don, and the smaller meeting room is behind the French Doors in the rear of the room. There are more of the round tables in the picture in storage, and plenty of chairs to go around.

The kitchen is in the rear left. It's full service and they serve meals from 5:00 to 8:00 PM so you can get a bite to eat before the meeting if you are in a hurry. The gas fireplace is a nice feature. The door with the Exit sign above leads to the ramp, and also to the pavilion behind the building.



This is the bar area downstairs. Their liquor license requires all nonmembers who buy alcohol to be a guest of a member. What Ralph will do is sign his name in the left column of the guest register, and we will sign ours in the right column as his guests. For \$1.00 drafts I think that's a small price to pay.



The bar itself. Very few patrons will be there Thursday night. Wednesday and Friday nights are their busy nights so we are a good fit for them.

The pool table is available for our use as well, as well as the pull-tab lottery machines. If the stairs are a problem, there is a smaller "portable bar" upstairs in the meeting room that can be stocked before the meeting. I do not have a problem of being a "go'fer" either if someone would like a drink.
