NAMGAR-GT44 MGVR Road America Vintage Races

Last July 10-14, the North American MGA Register (NAMGAR), held its 44 th annual national gathering in Dubuque, Iowa. GT- 44 was hosted by the Minnesota MG Vintage Racers. Given that MG racers hosted the GT, MGA race cars were featured at the event. Another thing the Minnesota racers did was to schedule GT- 44 the week before the MG Vintage Racers (MGVR) Focus Event at the Road America track near Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin. For me, it was nice to have these 2 MG events back to back. Many of my MGA friends from the West were coming to GT- 44 and many of my racing friends were going to be at the MGVR Focus Event. I had raced "222" at the first MGVR Road America Focus Event in 2001, so I was looking forward to being back there with "222" and having Bethel enjoy the MGVR event and hospitality.

As you would expect, GT- 44 had many events including tours into the countryside. One was a ride to the *Field of Dreams* location used in the movie. It's about 40 miles from Dubuque, but the field is just as it was in the movie and touring the original house made for a wonderful afternoon.

The Guest of Honor for GT- 44 was famous international racer, **David Hobbs**. Hobbs and our own Tony Makepeace, are friends as they went to the same school in the UK. For this event, a local winery made special labels with MGs on them and one with Hobbs. We had a BBQ at the winery on Friday. MG race cars were featured and Hobbs was the guest speaker. He signed labels on wine bottles (Racing Riesling) and large posters similar to the labels. From my conversations with Hobbs, I found him to be very down to earth. That came through during his presentation at the BBQ (racing for Jag, in Formula 1, 5000 and at Le Mans, Sebring, Watkins Glen etc.).

Saturday was the car show held in a park adjacent to the Mississippi River. Over 100 cars were entered including some outstanding restorations. There was also an MGA that was used as a Police Car in the UK and 4 Magnette sedans. That night was the banquet and awards. Along with awards, we saw a lovely presentation about GT- 45. It will be in Colorado Springs and we are already making plans to be there and visit daughter Rachel and family too. I'm also planning to "borrow" Rachel's BGT for GT- 45.

GT- 44 was a wonderful event, but after our good-byes, it was time to head to Elkhart Lake, WI and Road America. We got there Sunday in time for dinner at Siebkens. Through the streets racing started at Elkhart Lake in 1951, 3 years after the first Glen race. Siebkens was the natural gathering place, like the Seneca Lodge is at WG, so hade to go there.

We got "222" out of the trailer on Monday and had some nice Wisconsin back road rides. Tuesday we went to the Road America track as we wanted to sit in on special Kent Prather (6 time SCCA National Champion in an MGA) How-To-Drive Road America sessions. Kent even gave bus rides showing the correct line and in the afternoon any MG racer who paid \$100, got 3 lead-follow and feedback sessions to perfect their skill.

This was a major Vintage race called the "Hawk" with about 300 vintage cars there along with a Can-Am reunion event. About 30 MGs (Pre-War, T Series, MGA, B, C and Midgets) were racing. Bethel was on Chris Meyers MGA crew and I crewed for Dave Nicholas' very fast MGA called "Honey Bee". The all MG race was on Sunday and there was some good racing in the field, but Kent Prather, in his very highly modified SCCA MGA was first from the drop of the flag. Two MGBs finished behind him and Dave Nicholas was 4th and the first vintage MGA to cross the line.

It was nice to be back at Road America again with "222" and the MGVR Focus Event was tops in every way. Along with all the good MG racing, we had great MGVR fun, food and camaraderie that is second to none. **Safety Fast**


