






Laycock De Normanville Overdrive – possibly the best option ever offered on our LBCs!

The Laycock overdrive was invented in the UK and started to become available as an option on various cars in the 1950s. It is essentially a planetary gearset that is triggered by a solenoid (thus 'electric overdrive'). When engaged, the planetary gears offer a gear-reduction of about 22-28% depending on which model is used. It bolts on the tail end of gearboxes. It was a relatively inexpensive way for manufacturers to offer an extra 'gear' without the cost and effort of redesigning and retooling gearboxes to go from 4-speed to 5-speed for instance.

In the beginning, there were only two models offered: the large A-Type, which was used on a wide variety of large-engined and big torque-producing cars from Triumphs through Austin-Healeys, Jaguars, etc. Smaller cars used the D-Type – Sunbeam Alpines, early Triumph Spitfires, early Volvos, and MGBs through 1967 when using the 3-synchro MG gearbox. Later, the overdrive models proliferated a little more. Identifying an overdrive unit is usually as simple as reading the Laycock data plate located on the unit. However, there are some nuances associated with the units that were offered on numerous cars. For instance, a Triumph J-Type has a different application code than an equivalent Volvo J-Type. I believe in most cases these alternate versions will bolt up to their gearbox, but might have some variation in terms of speedo output gearing, or actual overdrive reduction (might be a 25% unit instead of an original 28% unit).

While true applications tables have been pretty hard to locate online, I have started to create a chart of all the applications numbers I have found online whenever someone posts about their overdrive unit or has one for sale on the auction sites. It is now about a 2-page table and I believe from the patterns that have emerged that I can identify many versions of these gearboxes by the application numbers.

Overdrive Type	Applications
A-Type	TR3-early TR6; Austin Healeys; Jaguar XKs through 1960s saloons;
	Aston Martins and even some early Ferraris(!)
D-Type	MGB 1962-67 (3-synchro gearbox); early Spitfire, Sunbeam
	Aplines, Volvos through approx. 1968
LH-Type	MGB 1968-80, MGC, MGB GT V8
J-Type	Mid TR6, GT6, other Triumphs, many Volvo models through 1980
P-Type	Late Volvos (lacks speedo cable drive)
Compact A-Type	Late 1960s-late 1970s Jaguars mostly saloons

I believe that Laycock overdrives faded away by the early 1980s. A division of the original company still provides rebuild services and parts in the UK.

A few points on MGB versions: the D-Type (1962-67) had a special vacuum switch and relay mounted on the firewall. The LH-Type that was introduced with the 1968 MGB originally came in a 'black label' version. These are associated with 1968-74 MGB gearboxes that also retained a gearbox dipstick, and 1280 turns-per-mile speedo output. The 'blue label' versions are more associated with the later cars which had a side-fill plug for gearbox oil, and had a 1000 turns-per-mile speedo output.

It is fairly easy to mix and match to get everything set up correctly. All MGBs from 1968 onward used the same driveshaft, so nothing needed there. The MGC used the black label LH-Type. I was surprised when looking at the overdrive on my BGT V8 that it was a red label. It turns out they were beefed up a little for the V8 application—they had stronger internal springs and a stronger internal clutch material but are otherwise the same.

How did I happen to get into this research? I am looking to add overdrive to my Daimler SP250 restoration. The Daimler essentially used a close-ratio version of the Triumph TR3 gearbox but never offered overdrive, and an A-Type conversion will literally bolt up to the gearbox. However, that bulky early A-Type version will cause installation problems in the car (transmission tunnel, handbrake interference, even interference with the seats). It turns out that the later Triumph or Volvo J-Type can be adapted to the Daimler gearbox and is strong, and a much better fit, so that is what I am pursuing, with thanks to those who have researched and shared their experiences.

If you have an MGB, or TR that was offered with overdrive but you don't have one, is it worth pursuing one? I say Absolutely Yes. It will raise the value of your car in addition to providing nice operation in service. There are several local options including Ben at British Auto in Macedon who is very skilled with gearbox repairs and rebuilds, so it is very feasible to find a used overdrive gearbox, have it rebuilt for you, and then you can install it and enjoy.


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















UPCOMING - Fall Tour 2021






