Happy Summer! Recently while going through some old *Spokes* we have for Dan



Our basket auction proceeds also went toward establishing the initial \$10K amount of the fund. Memorial plaques were engraved for long-time members who passed away. Frank has been keeping those up to date for many years with the Club covering the minimal cost of engraving. It's not determined at this time where the plaque will now be located since we no longer use the MCC auto shop for our tune-up clinic. More discussion is needed to determine where to keep the very large



and heavy plaque, how to display it and how to keep it updated.



The Club voted for a \$300 donation to go to Edison Tech's Automotive programs. Because it is a public school and cannot receive direct donations, Hollis Hames will talk to Bobby Newell, the program director, and arrange to buy tools or some other needed item for the program.


Honor Flight - Honoring American Veterans

Mike Helton to be Honored as the Next Recipient of the IMRRC Cameron R. Argetsinger Award

WATKINS GLEN, N.Y. (May 26, 2022) – Mike Helton, Vice Chairman of NASCAR, is selected to join an elite group of recipients of the Cameron R. Argetsinger Award for Outstanding Contributions to Motorsports. Presented annually by the International Motor Racing Research Center (IMRRC), the Award's past recipients include Chip Ganassi, Roger Penske and Mario Andretti. The gala and award ceremony will be held on Aug. 19, 2022, at the Watkins Glen Harbor Hotel. Motorsports broadcast journalist Dr. Jerry Punch will be emceeing the evening's festivities.

"The Cameron R. Argetsinger Award continues to honor exemplary contributors to motorsport," said Mark Steigerwald, Executive Director of the IMRRC. "We enthusiastically extend this well-deserved recognition to Mike and look forward to celebrating in August."

Helton has been part of the NASCAR company for almost three decades, starting as the vice president of competition in 1994. He was the first person outside of the France family to assume responsibility for the day-to-day operations when he became the senior vice president and chief operating officer in 1999, and president a year later. Today, Helton serves as a member of NASCAR'S Board of Directors and Executive Council.

Helton's experiences on and off the track directly led to the formation of the NASCAR Research & Development Center in Concord, North Carolina. Dedicated to strengthening NASCAR's safety and competition initiatives, it is the first research and development center owned and operated by a sanctioning body of a major motorsports series.

"We are honored to present the 2022 Cameron R. Argetsinger Award to Mike Helton," said IMRRC Chairman John R. Saunders. "Under Mike's leadership, NASCAR's expansion to new markets throughout North America along with notable enhancements to safety and competition is truly extraordinary."

Tickets are on sale now and all proceeds benefit the IMRRC. Presenting sponsors of the award dinner are Sahlen's, NASCAR, and Watkins Glen International. Additional support is provided by the Watkins Glen Harbor Hotel.





Not sure if they were Zweigles or Tobin First Prize hots, but back in 1971, the hots were left over from an MGCC event and the club was having a hot dog roast at the Wild's Wagonjack Farm. Many in our MGCC were very

interested in racing back then and, in '61 & '62, our WNYMGCC put on the first *All MG Races* in North America at Watkins Glen. So it was not unusual that there was always conversation about racing at events. The rumor was that the 1972 Monaco Grand Prix would be the last one. As many of you know, the Monaco GP continues to this day, but back then it looked like '72 would be the last one.

During the discussion about the end of the Monaco GP, Al Isselhard and Marv Brudno (Brudno Award named for him and his wife) decided to look into putting a trip together to go to the "last" Monaco GP. As things worked out, the 1000 km race at Spa, Belgium, a week before Monaco, would be included. Then we would have a week to do our own thing and, after that, all meet in Monaco for the GP. We would leave from JFK



on May 4 and return from Brussels on May16. All our air fare and hotel accommodations in Brussels, Liege (near Spa) and Niece France would be included for the total of \$419.72! Those were 1972 dollars, but it also included our Rochester

flights to and back from JFK.

With a deal like that, Al Isselhard led a group of WNYMGCC members that included: Gil and Betty Langswager, Bob and Ruth Philip, Steve and Patty Philip and olde me. Al also advertised the trip in Autoweek and a few others from Rochester and around the US also joined us on the trip.

Both Spa and Monaco are still run on public roads, but Spa is out in the country and Monaco through the streets of the city. The Spa 1000 Km race was won by Redman and Merzario in a Ferrari. Local hero Jackie Ickx, with Clay Regazzoni, finished second in a Ferrari. Betty sure likes Jackie Ickx and was able to get through the gigantic crowd, that surrounded him at the end of the race, to get his autograph!

At Monaco, there were different tickets for different areas. Our 50 Franc "metal" ticket allowed us to be around Start/Finish, the first turn and then walk over the track on a foot bridge and see the last section, along the Mediterranean. That led to the old "Gasometer" hairpin turn where most of us watched the race. Its name comes from where they used to fill the race cars with gas.






