

His face was totally red, Glistening sweat on his forehead, As he climbed slowly out of the car,





NUFFIELD TROPHY TO RETURN TO ENGLAND

The Nuffield trophy is a large silver urn awarded to competing centres of the MG Car Club, Ltd. The Nuffield Challenge Trophy was annually awarded to the best centre of the MG Car Club in Great Britain. Lord Nuffield was a strong patron of the MG Car Club Ltd. The first Nuffield Trophy was in 1935. With the international growth of the MG Car Club after WWII, four Nuffield Trophies were awarded. One for Europe, one for the U.S., one for Africa and one for the Pacific area. Trophies were awarded to that centre showing "the most meritorious growth, enterprise and initiative." The trophy was last awarded in 1961 to the Western New York Center (Rochester-Buffalo area). Other previous winners were Long Beach Centre in 1954, 1957 and 1958, Washington D.C. Centre in 1955, Elmira NY Centre in 1956, Chicago Centre in 1959, and Western NY Centre in 1960 and 1961.

The Western NY Centre received the trophy in 1960 and 1961 for it's extremely strong and well-attended program throughout the year. The program consisted of monthly rallyes averaging 60 or more participants, a concourse d'elegance at the Watkins Glen Gran Prix and an all-MG Marque race held at Watkins Glen.

At the time of notification of the trophy awarded to the Western NY Centre in '61, Chairman, Charles Heindl, was told to hang on to the Nuffield until he was contacted again by England. As it turned out that was 24 years later!

In 1983 a long time member of the NY Centre asked whatever happened to the Nuffield. By that time no one clearly remembered where it was any more. It had been on display at a prominent Rochester NY MG Dealer for some time, but no longer. We knew someone in the club had it, but who? Richard Powers, a former club chairman, began an investigation by interviewing past members. This route led him to find the trophy with Charles Heindl. Mr. Heindl left the club in the late 1960's and felt he was still personally responsible for the Nuffield so he took it with him. He would do this he said until he was contacted by England to do otherwise. The culmination of Mr. Power's efforts was at our 25th Annual Year End Party in December of 1983, when the Nuffield was put on display for all to see. Our hopes for return of the trophy to the club's collective possesion were dashed when Mr. Heindl decided to take

the trophy home with him again. We consoled ourselves in that we had at least seen the trophy and we knew where it was.

Late in 1984 the North American Representative of The MG Car Club, David Haywood, wrote in Abingdon Classics of trying to locate the U.S. Nuffield Trophy. The wheels were set in motion and, with some contact with England, the Western NY Centre is once again in possesion of the loveted Challenge Trophy.

On August 21, 1985 an official delegation from our club headed by George Heissenberger (former chairman), Susanne Keppeler (current Chairperson), Richard Powers (former chairman, current publisher) and David Wild (former chairman) arrived at Heindl's in an MG caravan: George's '73 MGB, Dick's '66 MGB, Sue's '61 MGA MKII "Deluxe"... Mr. Wild, owner of more than half a dozen MG's, drove an American vehicle. After brief re-introduction we presented Mr. Heindl with a plaque from our centre "for his trusteeship of the Nuffield Trophy 1960-1985. Mr. Heindl surrendered the Nuffield to us. We posed for several pictures with Sue's MGA MKII "Deluxe" as a backdrop.

Mr. Heindl brought out champagne and we all toasted the future and past of the MG Car Club, the Nuffield, the Western NY Centre, etc. (If we had more champaign, we would have toasted more!) We then proceeded to exchange anecdotes about our centre's past and present rallyes, shows, gymkhana and races. Mr. Heindl told us about the many MG's he had owned, beginning with a TC and other sports cars he had the pleasure of driving in the late 50's and early 60's.

The evening ended with everyone shaking hands, collecting the trophy (in a delightful walnut case presented by The Long Beach Centre) and heading for home. I thought it only fitting after so long that I drove the Nuffield home in my '73 MGB. It hadn't been in an MG for years.

Plans are for 2 of our members, Gil and Betty Langswager, to fly to England and personally return the Nuffield to Bill Wallis, Chairman of the MG Car Club Ltd. The Nuffield Challenge Trophy will then be restored and placed on display for future possible reawarding to Centres throughout the world.




