

## Chairman's Corner By Bob Welch



### Vice Chairman's Corner

Happy Holidays to everyone! I hope to see you all at the Western NY MG Car Club Christmas party in December and am looking forward to meeting John Twist. Thank you for your support as I transition into the club Chairman's position for 2023. I was last Chairman in the mid 1980s so it's not new but has been a while!

I was looking through some old photos recently and came across this photo of my dad's friend's 1967 Ferrari 275 GTB. My dad had a friend at work named Joe, who was very good as a mechanic and used to make a few bucks by buying exotic sportscars from ads in Autoweek that didn't run and needed repair and fixing them up in order to flip them for a profit. He made enough to build a nice detached 2-3 car garage at his house with all the right tools and equipment for car repairs. There was a slow stream of Maserati, Ferrari, etc. he would fix and flip including some nice motorcycles too. He was especially good at fixing Ferrari V-12 engines. There was some common problem, I forget exactly what, that involved needing to pull the heads and replace head gaskets and Joe was a pro at it. Might have been a timing belt or chain, I really don't remember the specifics. Anyway, this was mid 1970s and even at that time I realized what a bargain he bought some of these cars for. Around the summer of 1975 he showed up at our house with his latest repair, a 1967 Ferrari 275 GTB V12 in maroon with butterscotch leather interior and styled knock off disc wheels. It was a drop-dead gorgeous car and looked factory fresh. I took a number of photos of it in our driveway in Penfield. Then Joe offered to take me for a ride. First off, Joe didn't believe in seatbelts, so they had been removed from the car. Second, he drove fast. On regular side streets. I was sliding around the whole trip in the beautiful leather bucket passenger seat which must have been freshly Armor-Alled. We went for about a ten-minute quick trip around Penfield and it was amazing. I remember zooming down Creek street and left on to Browncroft, then he turned sharp right onto Panorama trail at very high speed

and the car just stuck to the road like glue. Unlike me who was hanging on for dear life in those beautiful but slippery leather seats and loving every minute of it. The sound of the engine was magnificent, and Joe was justifiably proud of the job he had done and showing what the car could do. All too soon, the ride was over, and we were back in our driveway. In the photo you can see my 1968 Firebird in front of the Ferrari. I later traded in the Firebird for a 1970 Opel Kadette Rally (instantly regretted it). The next year I bought my first MG, a 1971 MGB in June of 1976. Joe soon sold the 275 GTB and within a year or two he was working on a Kawasaki Mach III motorcycle. They were one of the first superbikes with a 500 cc three-cylinder engine producing around 60 HP. From what I have read if you kept the bike under 4000 RPM it was docile, but above 5000 RPM it turned into a real beast. Joe took the bike over to our house and besides being wowed by the three cylinders and 70's styling I remember it had a leopard skin seat cover. I've heard Mach III's were called the widowmaker, and that was true in Joe's case. Soon after he got the bike repaired and before he could sell it, Joe was killed when he was riding the Kawasaki Mach III and hit a telephone pole. Rest in Peace Joe.

## Cannonball Baker Sea-To-Shining-Sea Memorial Trophy Dash – 1972

## Four Rochesterians enter Cannonball Baker race

Given good driving, good weather, and perhaps a touch of good luck, four castside Rochester residents may win the accordance of Connonial Baker Sea to Shriting Sea Memorial Teophy Dash, which starts November 19 and runs over public roads from New York City to Redondo Beach, California.

The drivers, Doug Blue, Tom Carrozoni, Sam Lineoln, and Doug Scribner, have entered a modified 1970 Chevrolet Monte Carlo in the race, and together they comprise the only team entered from the Rochester area. Also entered are 34 other teams from around the country, many of whom are race drivers, professional prople, and other drivers experienced at highspeed cross-crountry touring.

SCCA racers Fred Kepler, Brad Niemcek, and past Continental Champton Tony
Adamowica are running, along with Terry
Cook, editor of Hot Rod Magazine; Edsal
Ford, xon of Honey Ford II; eminent
European motorsport journalist David
Phipps, and Bruck Yates, senior editor of
Car and Driver and unofficial promotes
of the event.

Yates, along with former Grand Prix driver Dan Gurney, won the first Cannon-ball last year in a Kirk White sponsored Ferrari 365 GTB/4 Daytona. Tugether they made the 2900 mile trip in less than 36 hours, averaging 80 mph despite nine fuel stops and a speeding apprehension.

Rules for the cace are minimal, and the winner is the team with the shortest clapsed time over any chosen route between the Red Ball Garage in midtown Manhattan, and the parking lot of the Poctofino Inn its Redondo Beach.

Types of vehicles entered range from an Austin Healey 3000 and a 1951 Studebaker up to the inevitable 240Z's. Convetes, and Porsches. Numerous vans and two motor homes are running, along with a Cadillac limousine, a bus, an Excalibor classic Mercedes replicar, and reportedly the Chappan-2] "Vacuum Cleaner" Can-Am ear.

Preparation on the Rochester entry, which was put together by Lincoln and Carrozoni in Lincoln's Suncco station on Monroe Avenue in Brighton, was done with an eye toward increasing the mileage covered between fuel stops, and enhancing the car's high speed cruising capability.

Lincoln fitted an extra fuel tank inside the trunk, bringing total fuel capacity up to 45 gallons. Giant Cibie Super Oscar driving lights were mounted to the front humper, along with Cibic quarar iodine conversion units in the normal headlight sockets.

For power, the red and black Monte

Carlo relies on a hefty 454 cable inche Cherrolet engine, filted with Hooker headers. Crane sold-lifter cam and value-train, a cast aluminum Edelbrock "tarantula" in take manifold, and a 1150 cfm Holley fusionaried earbureter. Lincoln estimates with horsepower at 475.

Behfod the engine is a three-speed

Behind the engine is a three-speed Turbo 400 automatic transmission with special modifications to the valve body. Lincoln also fitted a long-legged 2.73 Positraction rear axie, which together with the engine gives the car an estimated top speed of 150 mph.

The car is also fitted with heavy duty suspension components and Koni shocks along with Goodyear HR70 Polysteel radial tires supplied by Red Kosinski's Speed Shop in Scottsville. Beyond that the car looks quite normal; in fact, probably more normal than the other cars running the

As for driving experience, both Lincoln and Carretroni bring past involvement in late-model stocks and drag racing to the team. Carrosoni is an employee of Ruchester Telephone.

Blue, owners of Racing USA, a retail and mail order sports car accessories outlet in Ponsford, brings past experience in autocrossing and several major rallies to the team. Scribner, owner of Mint City, a mail order supplier of imported Austin Mini parts on Rochester's cast side, is a competitor in SCCA amateur small sedan racing. The team members hope their combined

experience, aligned with a strategy of four drivers, and co-ordinated fuel stops will give them a decided advantage in the coastto-coast race. by R. J. Hughes

Thanks to everyone who participated.


