
opportunity to organize an encapsulation of what we're about and what we've been up to, month by month. Thank you all for the opportunity I've enjoyed.



Meet Glen Watkins, One Special Bear

I started life in 1990 in Watkins Glen, NY. I came from a thrift store sheep skin "bomber jacket" coat that my creator found while accompanying her husband, Chuck, to the Watkins Glen Vintage Festival. Patti Woodworth loved to go to the races where she could spend time with her friends, many of them fellow MGCC members. Shopping was a must as the shops in the village were loaded with treasures. Always on the lookout for things that she could use to make a unique teddy bear, this coat caught her eye. It was far from perfect, but there was more than enough fur to make a good-sized teddy bear. My fur was packed carefully in the limited space of the 1967 Austin Healey 3000 Mk III that had brought Chuck and Patti to the races from Honeoye Falls, NY.



My birth took much more than 9 months, as creating a unique pattern and cutting and sewing the dense fur and strong sheepskin backing was far more difficult than your average bear! As part of Patti's business (Bears by PAW), she was frequently asked to create a "memory bear" from someone's treasured coat. Many times she had to refuse, as the fur backing had become brittle and was impossible to sew.

Once I was complete, I needed a name. Patti gave every bear a unique name and a special tattoo on the



foot pad. Her customers would often ask how she came up with the name for each bear. Her answer was always the same. "The bear will tell you its name." Thus, I came into this world as "Glen Watkins".

I acquired a leather "Stirling Moss" style racing cap, sometimes a white silk scarf and a denim vest that displayed the special pins, most race and sportscar related, that I had collected over the years. I showed up at many MG Car Club events, and eventually became a member with my own MGCC badge that I still wear proudly to this day.


When Patti retired to North Carolina in 1998, I also retired from



attending car races. It was far too hot for a bear used to New

York winters. I am living out my retirement in an air-conditioned bear museum full of my brothers and sisters. Now that my creator, Patti, has passed away, I am grateful for all the great times we shared together and the memories we created along the way. Happy Motoring to all and "Safety Fast"

MG (S)MILES and a few tears Part IX

 \mathbf{F} or some months now I have been talking about our trips in the TD and only mentioned the TF in passing, but it is time to give you a little more information about the TF and how it came into our possession. In the early '70s there was a member of the MGCC by the name of Bob Moran. Bob was a music teacher and musician (trombone) who loved his MG TF and the MG Car Club. He taught at John Marshall High School and had a number of students who were quite taken with his car (those were the days when you could park an MG TF in a parking lot and expect to find it when you came out and all in one piece). We got to know Bob quite well and saw him not only at meetings but also on some of our T Series trips. He had a beautiful baritone voice and acquired the nickname of "Bugsy" somewhere along the way. He was Bugsy even to his students and was a marvelous teacher. He told us of the night (some time after he had a heart attack and recovered) that he was under his car working on it in the garage one night. His wife Marsha became worried when he was out there so long and when she went out to check on him found he had fallen asleep under the car. This was Bob Moran.

In 1974 while on vacation in Wisconsin, Bob suffered another massive heart attack from which he did not recover. It was a loss to all of us as he was a good friend and loyal member of the club. Marsha asked Gil Langswager if he would appraise the car as she needed this for the estate settlement. She was adamant though that she would not sell the car as she had two daughters who loved that car and wanted to keep it. She called me and asked if I knew of anywhere she could store it for the winter. I had just put the addition on my garage and the TD was lonesome in there all winter, so I told her to bring it out and store it at my house. I wouldn't hear of any rental charge but was more concerned that the car would be someplace where it could be looked after, rather than buried in the back of a barn someplace. Gil and Marsha brought the car out. We took off the plates and I asked her to leave the

key with me so I could start it occasionally. I had a spare car cover, so I covered it up and it became the stablemate of my TD for the winter.

Spring came and Marsha called me and asked when I wanted the car removed. I told her it is not in my way and to do it whenever she wanted to. I had washed it whenever I did the TD and started it up so it was operational at all times. It could be driven off at any time. But it was not in my way and looked so nice sitting there next to the TD.

Then in August I got a phone call from Marsha. She told me she had talked with the girls and seeing that the car couldn't be cut in half they all decided it was best to sell it. She asked me if I knew of anyone interested in the car. It was now like a member of our family, so I told her I was. She said that Gil had given her two figures on the value of the car, one high and one low. She said that she had to get the high figure, told me what it was, and I had one word, SOLD. The following Saturday we went to her house with a check and in a matter of a few minutes my TD now had a partner. We licensed the car and began driving it. There were some things that needed to be done but nothing urgent. I took my time and little by little got the car the way I thought it should be. I replaced the top with a new one that kept the water out, painted the undersides of the fenders (wings) the same crocus yellow color as the car (not red) and had the wire wheels stripped and painted. I did some necessary mechanical work, and the car was fun to drive. It was a lot different than the TD being a little more roomy, and also a little more powerful (1500 cc vs. 1250 cc).

We drove the car to a number of T Register Gatherings, and Jim and I took it up to Oshawa in Ontario on one occasion. Nancy and I did the whole New England Mountain Adventure route in the car all alone and ended up at the Gathering at Killington where we had the pleasure of meeting Jean Kimber Cook (Cecil Kimber's daughter), who remains our friend today.

MG (S)MILES and a few tears - Part IX

The car performed well on all its outings with only one problem on the way home from Vermont. (see MG(S)MILES part VII). It has always been a fun car and one I will never part with. It is a wonderful memory of a good friend.

About three years after I bought the car I was at the show in Victor, and Bob's daughter came up to

me to say hello. She said that she had seen the car and approved very much of the few things that I had done to it. She asked if we could go over and see the car together. We did and I know she was thinking of her father as she looked and admired. She noted all the changes with approval and asked if she could sit in the car. I told her, by all means She got in the passenger's seat while I got behind the wheel. She iust looked around and smiled. She then asked me if I would start. the car. I did and that was all it took. We both "lost it" and had a good emotional few minutes just thinking about a father and a friend. She thanked me and I told her she had visitation privileges whenever she wanted to come over. I think though that day was sort of closure for

her as I have never seen her since. I hope she is well because I think of her and that day every time I look at the car.

Many years ago, the TD got the name the "Butter Dish." (I'll explain that later sometime) and the person that named it aptly named the TF

"Buttercup" which is fitting seeing the color and cheerfulness of its personality. The names have stuck for many, many years. The TF has never been restored but rather maintained and cared for. (Looked after, as Al Colquhoun would say) I did replace the clutch once by removing only the transmission. It's sort of like tying your shoes by

reaching down through your pant legs. It can be done but there is an easier way.

While Bob was teaching, one of his students was a voung man named Steve Kotzin. Steve's father and I had gone to Franklin High together and Steve loved Bob's car and alwavs honed someday would own it. He didn't realize until many years later after he had purchased a TF of his own, that I was the one who bought Bob's car. He and his father gave his TF a complete frame restoration and made many

trips to our house to check out details on a car that was all together. It also brought back many memories and stories about Bob. Steve's father and Bob had both been members of the Monroe County Parks Band. For a while, Steve was a member of the MGCC.

His TF won its class at the T Register meets and also won a National Senior First in AACA judging. A few years ago, Steve moved to Orlando and married and is raising a family there. We will probably see him when we go to Orlando in October. He told me he did the car as a tribute to his friend and teacher Bob Moran. Bob would have been proud of the results. The car is done in a beautiful shade of (light) green with a tan interior and top. It is magnificent in every way,

but especially so in one respect. Out front it proudly sports an authentic British number plate that simply reads: BUG Z.

A fitting tribute to a fine man from an equally fine and sensitive young man. I'm sure "Buttercup" and Bob approve.

Since the last time the car was registered was in 1982, I have some serious work to do to get her back on the road, but the engine turns freely with the hand crank. Luckily it's not seized up. As you know dad bought the car from Bob Moran's wife after Bob passed away. I only remember the car being driven a few times, as you mentioned once to the GOF near Killington Vermont, I also remember it was driven to a GOF in North Conway but not sure what year that was. I do remember one time at the RIT car show, Bob and Dad were parked next to each other. They became good friends first through the cars and then through their love of music. Bob was a horn player and had a very deep voice.


I hope everyone has enjoyed this series on MG TFs in our club history. In October 2023, we featured the TFs of current club members Mike Robinson, Dick Rzepkowski, and John Thompson. In November, we featured the former TFs of John Forrester, Paul Heaney, and Steve Philip. This month we are featuring the TF of Jim Herschell. There are a few additional cars and photographs to share.

- 1. HDB46/9467. Black TF 1500 owned by John Walker of Thorold, Ontario Canada. I found this picture on the cover of *Spokes* July 1997 where this car was Best MG of Show at our Victor Car Show that year! In perusing *Spokes* in that timeframe, I see that John Walker joined our club. Thorold is just west of Niagara Falls, Canada. I found the Car Number via the Registry below.
- 2. HDA46/4294. Black TF 1250 owned by John Leone of the Syracuse area. John is a member of the European Motor Club (formerly MGCC Central NY Centre) and is friends with our club member Frank Gordnier. John brought his beautiful TF to our show this past August. John said he did a rear axle ratio conversion on the car and finds it is better at expressway speeds now.
- 3. Black TF from Fairport that attended our car show in 2019. (Car No. unknown). Mike Robinson captured this picture of this TF parked next to Gil and Betty's red TD at our 2019 show. It is not wearing TF 1500 badges in the photo, so is likely a 1250cc car. Hopefully we will get a chance to meet up with this TF owner sometime soon and see if they might like to join our club!
- 4. HDE43/2192 Charlie Searles, Pultneyville. I was unable to connect with Charlie in time for this series but hope to do so in the future. Charlie has owned this TF for decades and has thoroughly enjoyed this car at MGCC events and New England MGT Register events as well.
- 5. Another TF, in tan/brown colors, is in the Webster area. I hope to have further details on this car in the future.

Lastly, several long-time members of our club provided details to me of other former TFs:

From Gil:

- Here are some more TF's that were in the club. Bob Jeffers had a black 1500 named "Maggie". He worked for General Dynamics. Left in the late 60's & moved to New Hampshire. He was quite active in the club. He & I did a lot of work on cars together.
- I can't remember his name, but he was an early member with a gray TF with red wheels. It is pictured in the scrapbook at a Funkhana in the early 60's.
- Tom Maracle lived in Webster, near George Herschell. George knew him. He went to a GOF with us & bought a TF which Betty drove back for him. He was only in the club for a short time then sold the car. That was in the late 60's.

- Bill Lang lived in Greece & had a nice red TF in the mid 60's. Only a member for a short time.
- Chuck Heindl & I used to buy & sell MG's. He bought a black TF that he loaned (or gave) to Rich Palumbo which was used as a pattern for the Victor TF. I don't know what happened to that car.

From Al Isselhard

(Dan note: it appears the same black TF that Gil describes above was first purchased by Al Isselhard): The TF was a real project car and I bought it to flip. I owned the TF that was eventually purchased by the group in Victor that used the car to make a TF kit car. I think one of the guys involved was a fellow named Rich Palumbo who sold us life or house insurance. I think we bought the TF in the late 1970's from a country guy who had stored the car in a barn in Genesee County, maybe near Elba. Some time after, we sold the car.

Al Isselhard gives "Racing Superstitions & Bizarre Events" presentation at the Argetsinger Symposium

Long time MGCC member and founding member of the WNY Morgan Owners Group, Al Isselhard, gave a presentation about *Auto Racing Superstitions and Bizarre Events* last November 4 at the 7th annual IMRRC Michael Argetsinger Symposium on International Motor Racing History. Al started things off with a well-received presentation.

For a number of years, he was curious about where racing superstitions like the color green, #13 and peanuts came from. Al said the color green superstition may have started at a race on the Syracuse oval in 1926 after




Lee Oldfield's "green" racer blew a tire and ended up in the infield where many spectators were located.

The number "13" has long been associated with superstitions and racers are no exception. According to Al, Indy




