
A tiny Love Affair!!



Seems this car was put together with whatever was on the shelf back then.

A True Account of the Rochester Street Rods Club Valve Cover Races

Four members of the MG Car Club Western NY Centre, Hollis Haymes, George Heissenberger, Bill and Cheryl Baldwin, joined the Rochester Street Rods club on Saturday February 17 at the Henrietta Moose Lodge for their 2024 Valve cover races.

In addition to our club the Street Rods had invited the Buffalo Rods and Custom club, so there were three clubs attending.

Boy what an eye opener it was! First off, the Street rods rules call for a track of 5' high, and 20' long, with a divider on each side and in between lanes, and a hard stop at the end of the course, padded by two foam cushions. What a hard stop it was! Cars can be up to 10 lbs and 30"

long X 12" wide. Front wheels should not protrude beyond the valve cover. They allowed our cars even though meeting different rules. All the racers drew cards which determined your

order of starting. After just two runs, My car split the front wooden axle from hitting the stop at the end. A quick run to the store across the street for electrical tape and it would hold long enough to complete my racing. Their rules are best two out of three races so no double elimination. My car lost both runs and I was soon out. Bill's car did well and he continued to race, and beat his car up little by little, breaking the frame after a couple

used it as a template and made my own out of walnut. I fit it to the car, drilled it for gauges and knobs, etc., and applied 10 coats of varnish (I got the woodworking thing from my Grandfather and then Dad); he approved.

There was more cleaning and painting (nope not from rattle cans); Dad bought a new compressor and a spray gun. We painted it in the garage... probably should have worn masks. We finished up the car, got it registered and actually drove it to one of the first "Wagon Jack Farm" car shows at Dave & Barb Wild's place.

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Empty Nesters and the story of Maggie, our '77 MG Midget

to a hunt for a 2 seat sports car.

Now mind you, I had never owned a 2 seat sports car, nor had my parents, nor had my wife, nor had her parents, we were truly neophytes to the concept of owning a 2 seat sports car but the thought of owning and driving one was exciting. At first, the only 2 seat sports car I could readily identify was the Chevrolet There were several listings for used Corvette. Corvettes in the local "Swap Sheet", so we called on a few of the ads and made arrangements to go look at some used Corvettes. I soon learned that the condition of the used Corvettes varied widely. Some we looked at we could not test drive because there would be some "minor" work required before anyone dared to drive it on the road. But we did find several serviceable and drivable Corvettes, however lesson 2 about Corvettes is that they rode like buck boards. My thoughts about relaxing drives through the finger lakes to the next vineyard for wine tasting seemed to get distorted by harsh handling and bumpy rides. Now remember, I was paying for my second child in college, so I wasn't looking at very expensive corvettes and most were well flogged by their previous owners. So maybe this sports car idea wasn't so great after all.

But as luck would have it, we passed a small rural car dealer on our way home from another disappointing look at a well-used Corvette. There on his lot was not one, but 2, small sports cars. There was an MG Midget and a Triumph TR7 sitting in the front

row of this rural dealer so we pulled in to check things out. I asked if both vehicles were drivable, and he said they were. Never having driven either of these types of cars I asked if it possible to test drive both of them, he said yes if I surrendered my driver's license to him which he would hold until I returned the car. He had no dealer plates either, so

this was going to be a short test drive for each vehicle. I liked the looks of the Midget and thought the Triumph TR7 was a bit on the ugly side. Marlene and I got into the Midget and drove down the road a little The car was surprisingly comfortable and peppy. Hmmm, this might be interesting. I drove back to the dealer and we took the TR7 down the same road. WOW, the TR7 was not nearly as comfortable and seemed twitchy on the road. I didn't think it was a big improvement over the Corvettes I'd been testing.

Back at the dealership we talked price for the Midget, he showed me it was a true barn find and the car had been stored with the top down. The top was so dry and torn there was no way it could be put up in the shape it was in, I must buy and install a new top. Knowing nothing about the availability of new tops for MGs or the price point for such a repair, I took the dealer's information and went home to think about the deal.



The story of Maggie, cont'd

Back home I did some internet searches and found 2 places that sold MG Midget tops, Moss Motors and Victoria British. The good news is that these seemed to be comprehensive parts suppliers for a car I knew nothing about. So with my research completed I called the dealer on Monday and he told me the car was SOLD. He said that a young guy had made the deal after I test drove it and would be bringing a down payment to the dealer later that day. We talked about the price he had agreed to with the young man and I boldly said, well if the deal falls through, here is my info and I will buy it at the price he had worked out with the other party. I also assured him I was an all-cash purchaser and I wouldn't be looking to make a down payment or get financing.

I don't know where the other deal fell apart, did the young guy never produce the down payment or did the rural dealer recognize that I was offering cash in hand. But come Tuesday, the dealer called me and said the young man he had sold the car to couldn't come up with the money so the car would be mine once cash was exchanged.

Well after exchanging cash for paperwork, I registered the car and received plates for it. Marlene and I drove down to pick it up and drive it home to Penfield. On the way home I discovered problem number 2, overheating at constant highway speeds. This issue did not show up in our short initial test drive but now merrily driving it on the 390 expressway for about 20 miles, the temperature gauge had climbed well above normal. I slowed the car from 65 mph down to 50 mph. The temperature dropped enough for me to get the car home and into my garage. Disaster averted.

At home the top was placed on order with Moss Motors and I researched radiator shops to boil out the radiator. While I was a newbie to owning MGs and 2 seat sports cars, I was not a stranger to used cars. My Dad helped me with the first car I ever owned back in high school, a 1965 Rambler American with a 3-speed manual transmission. I learned a lot from my Dad working on that car, and that experience would pay off over the years of owning MGs. So before the car ever got inspected, the radiator was removed, boiled out and re-installed. (Radiator service done at Browncroft Garage.) While the radiator was out, the top came in. Marlene and I followed the directions very carefully to ensure the top would be as well fitting as possible and the first top we installed is still the top that we use on that car today.

Marlene has always named our cars. This car was "Damask Red" a dark red, nearly maroon, from the factory and we have kept it true to the original factory color when it was repainted in a full restoration in 2001. Marlene wanted to keep the MG name within the personal name she gave the car, and so she selected Maggie. A woman's name seemed to be fitting for a red car. By coincidence, Margret Thatcher was the first female prime minister of Great Britain and she was often referred to in the press as Maggie. That seemed like a great name for our first British sports car and the name has stayed Maggie since she was first brought home.

One final note is since I didn't know anything about MGs, how did I find the MG Car Club? Well I have Barry Christ (a car club member and MGB owner) to thank for that. I worked at Harris Corporation and was driving the MG Midget into work. Barry, who also works at Harris, saw it in the parking lot at Harris (now L3Harris) and left me a note in the car letting me know there was an MG Car club in town. After getting some more info from Barry, Marlene and I attended our first MG Car Club meeting in the fall of 1997 and we have been members of the MG Car club ever since. So if you ever see an MG in a parking lot, drop in one of the info cards and let them know there is an MG Car Club in town that they can belong to.



Next change a badly rusting front door to a much better front door obtained from British Auto and ship the car off to the painter.

First remove everything from the body of the car, Including the engine. The engine goes off for a total rebuild at TW Automotive in Fairport (TW is no longer in business). At the painter's facility (Barry Brown at Riter's Restorations in East Rochester) more issues were discovered and dealt with.

In the end, the result was a pristine MG Midget that we were proud to take to various car shows as well as take on various club outings. We also took those relaxing drives through the finger lakes. We even drove it all the way to Stowe Vermont and entered it into the British Invasion. In 2023 we took it on a 200 mile day trip through the finger lakes stopping at a winery and eating dinner at a restaurant in Canandaiqua. My body is no longer as comfortable in that car since I have aged. My leg cramped while trying to hold the accelerator steady and I realized that I have gotten used to Cruise Control in my modern cars. The car is harder to get into and out of as we have both aged since the original acquisition, but it still rides the roads with a smooth ride and the performance is peppy enough to enjoy the drive on the twisty back country roads.

Like most cars that have been restored, the cost of restoration will never be recovered in the value of the finished product, just drive it and enjoy it while you can.



Saturday evening we will have a fun pub night style activity.


Sunday we are debating on hosting a car show with awards. Another possibility is to organize a funkhana and possible valve cover racing before we head our separate ways.


The Cars: The cars shall have no power source. All motive force is provided by gravity. Cars shall be based on an actual valve cover, rocker box or cam cover from an MG or other British made automobile engine. Wheelbase shall be no more than 24 inches. Note: The staging lane is only 24 inches long. Wheel Track shall be no more than 14 inches. Cars must have 4 wheels each, not to exceed 6 inches in diameter. Cars shall weigh 12 pounds or less. Car design should allow the front wheels to touch a 2-inch high starting gate. Any car changed during the race is subject to inspection

The Course: The course shall consist of a launch incline 8 feet long, followed by a level run of 20 feet. Two lanes shall divide the launch incline, each 2 feet wide. The incline shall be 2 feet high at the rearmost

part and level with the course at the front edge. The front edge shall be mitered to provide a smooth transition from the incline to the run-out area. The official "Starting Line" shall be 2 feet from the rear edge of the incline. A mechanized starting gate, which is 2 inches high, shall be provided. The Runout section of the course shall consist of 2 lanes, each 3 feet wide. The lanes shall be clearly marked. The finish line shall be marked 20 feet from the front edge of the launch incline.

The Races: Cars will run in heats of 2 cars each. The cars are to be launched with their front wheels on the starting line. If your car design does not allow for this, it is at a disadvantage. The first car to have its front wheels cross the finish line is the winner. If neither car reaches the finish line, the car going further within its lane wins. If the wheels of a car should touch or cross over a lane marker, the car shall be disqualified. The competing car immediately becomes the winner. The winner of the round is the first car to win 2 races. Lanes are alternated between races. Winning cars will advance to the next round until all are eliminated but 1 car. Scoring is double elimination to the finals. A car is eliminated after losing 2 rounds.




