Well the summer is flying by and now its September already! We had a great turnout at the August meeting. If only the Legion had remembered, we had a meeting that night. They were "closed for August" but thankfully one of their members came and opened up so we could have our meeting. I've been having fun getting photos for the Club's photo challenge. Lots of opportunities remain so its not too late to join in! Meanwhile I had a bit of a challenge of my own after the August MG Car Club meeting. On the way to the meeting my left turn signal started to become erratic. Sometimes it worked, sometimes it didn't. I had to jiggle the turn signal stalk to get it to come on. Right signal worked just fine. I tried flipping the hazard switch a few times forcefully as the manual recommends but that didn't fix it. On the way home from the meeting the left turn signal quit altogether. So I took apart the column the next day and sure enough the turn signal switch had broken a contact for the left side. Its an easy fix so I ordered the part from Moss, which was half the price of other suppliers by the way. As soon as it arrived a couple of days later I had it installed and everything worked. The next day driving the MG around town, there was a scratching sound every time I turned the wheel. Turns out when I reinstalled the plastic column covers I must have somehow bent the horn contact that is attached to the turn signal bracket and rides on a copper disc behind the wheel hub. After a few turns left and right, there was a loud snap and the horn doesn't work anymore. Off come the column covers and sure enough I broke off the contact for the horn. Besides that, I noticed the horn push brush had worn a hole right through the copper disc and had hung up on the horn contact. So I needed a new brush, disc and horn contact. So now the wheel has to come off to replace all that. Luckily Ben at British Auto has all the parts. Now I tried for two days to get the wheel off, I tried pulling by hand, tried a two jaw puller, and two three jaw pullers, even rented a steering wheel puller kit from Auto Zone, but none of the pullers would fit the angle of the cone shaped hub, so I could not use them. Luckily Ben said he could do it so OUR MG is currently with Ben at British Auto for a couple of days as I write this column.

To amuse myself before Ben could fit the MG in his schedule, I did an oil change and installed new fuzzy door seals around both doors. The seals were original and literally falling apart. A simple job to install, I ordered them from The Roadster Factory on a sale. I want to give The Roadster Factory some business since they had a devastating fire at their warehouse earlier this year. They have a limited amount of stock now and focus mostly on Triumph parts, but also some MGB parts. That's about it for now, I hope to see you out and about at one of our club events soon!

# MG Car Club Western New York Centre Bylaws: ARTICLE II Elected Officers

- 5. The term of office shall commence January 1st following the election of officers.

### **ARTICLE II Duties of Elected Officers**

1. It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preside at all meetings, to appoint all committees not

otherwise provide for, to enforce the observance of the by-laws and to cast the deciding vote in

case of ties.

Being a 1962 MGA, my old racer has a rather long racing history as well as a long connection to our MGCC. But even before getting 222, I think that seed to go racing was planted by my dad when he took me to my first race at Watkins Glen in 1951 when I was 8. They were still racing "through the streets" then and that made a big impression on me.

In the 60s I was in college, so no money to go racing. I did join SCCA and became a corner worker to get close to the race cars. That's when I met 222 (#2 then) and its owner, Bob Burns. Bob was also a member of our MGCC so this MGA has been in our MGCC since new.




Before racing the MGA, Bob raced a TD as a "club racer". Those racers drove their cars as transportation during the week and raced them on weekends. That was very common in the 50-60s as some of the SCCA rules didn't allow the modifications you see on most Vintage racers today. Nice to have all that power and expense now, but in the "old days" you had to learn how to drive your car fast. It was the "seat of your pants" that connected you to everything. And your car had to get you home after the racing weekend, so it had to be able to be driven on the street.

In the 60s and 70s, I thought I would go racing in my '66 MGB that I bought new. I had been very successful with it in autocrosses, but eventually getting married and having a family changed all that. Then in the late 80s, I got a call from Bob Burns. He and his wife had decided to move to California and he didn't want to take the MGA with him. He wanted me to have it because, of all his old SCCA friends, I wouldn't modify it into some wild racer. He was right and I



drove the MGA as fun transportation for 5 years. My daughter Rachel and I even drove it to Michigan for a John Twist "Summer Party."

One thing I did notice was how different it felt than driving my '66 MGB. I like driving my MGB, but I promised myself if I ever went racing, I would go racing in the MGA. From the time I got behind the wheel, I

knew that was the car. In 1993 there was a lot of talk about the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the MG Collier Cup that would be at the Glen in 1994. I asked friend Joe Tierno, who was racing an historic MGA, "029", what I had to do to get into that race. He said go to drivers school and at least get a roll bar and fuel cell in your MGA. I copied Joe's roll bar and put an ATL fuel cell in the trunk of the MGA. I didn't cut the floor because I knew that some day, I would want to drive it on the street again after I finished racing. I kept it like a "club racer" that was raced in the 60s. Also, for the first few years I raced it with the original numbers matching engine Burns raced with and Dunlop street radials. I did take the windshield off and used the Brooklands racing screen Bob used. One thing Bob did do was put in close ratio gears, just right for racing, but it was a club racer in every way those first few years. I loved racing it and I always had someone to race with.

Along the way, I decided that I should save the original motor and I found another 1622 block that racing friend, Dave Smith, built for me. The MGA 1622 crank is better than previous MGA cranks, but not as good as if it would also be a 5 main bearing one, like the later MGBs. So the advice from my MGA friends was to lighten and balance things as much as possible to save the crank. We cross drilled and filleted the crank, put in forged flat-topped JE pistons, a mild ATP cam that made power out to 6800 revs and, possibly most important, we put Carrillo rods in. At the time, these were the strongest and lightest rods available to protect the crank. A Kent Prather specially built oil pump went in and we naturally balanced everything we could. That's what's in it now along with a stock but enlarged "copper" radiator, points Alden distributor, a 4.3 open diff, exhaust header and SU HS-4 carbs instead of the H-4 stock ones. It's about a Stage 3 motor with 100 HP. That's 20-40 HP less than most other MGAs I raced with. I also lowered it an inch and put an MGB front end in for strength and to use MGB front calipers like other MGA racers did.

One other thing I did after about 5 years, was race on Hoosier 550 TD racing tires. For a long time, that was the only racing tire they would allow on my MGA. I know this may be hard to believe, but after switching to Hoosier racing tires, my lap times at the Glen were <u>8 seconds</u> less a lap!

222 has been a good reliable racer for 20 years. Naturally I raced it at Watkins Glen and: Shannon-ville Canada (That's my first official race in 222 and Alfa racer friend, Chuck Woodworth had to tow me there as I had no trailer.), New England International, Lime Rock, Road Atlanta, Mid Ohio, Road America – Elkhart Lake (good bratwurst sausages there) and Laguna Seca and Sears Point in California. There is another place I raced at and feel almost as close to as

Watkins Glen: Sebring in Florida. I raced there 3 times and enjoyed each time even more. Possibly it's the history of all the great 12 hour races, drivers and factory MGs, Healeys and Alfas that raced there. It's a feeling I can't explain. It's hallowed ground for me and 222, just like Watkins Glen.



One thing 222 and I were very good at was racing in the rain. Or as Dave Wild once said to me:"Rain – the great equalizer". I loved racing in the rain and knew I would move up 8-10 places by race end. At Road America, I did get a bit of a surprise. I passed a lot of fast MGBs going into Turn 1 and stayed ahead of them and others by the end of the All MG race. One of the B racers complemented me on my skill, but another was so upset that he came to the paddock while crew, Chuck Woodworth, and I were strapping the car down fast MGBs going into Turn 1 and stayed Chuck Woodworth, and I were strapping the car down in the rain to complain. He said something about my tires and

the only words I got in as he stormed off was that they were the only racing tires they would let me run. At that point I knew that Vintage Racing had lost its charm. Drivers' egos were now as big as the budgets for their race cars. In my MGA group, a winning Kent Prather motor (140 HP) was \$20,000!

In 2012, I did have a great race in the rain at the Glen with Canadian friend Jim Holody and his twin cam




MGA. We were nose to tail for most of the race and passed everything but 2 MGBs. I stayed ahead and finished 3<sup>rd</sup> overall and won the NAMGAR Bucher/Decker cup for the first MGA to cross the line in the Collier Cup race. That's a great honor and every MGA racer wants to win that trophy. Thanks to God and the rain for that one.

Joe Tierno has also won the Bucher/Decker Cup.

Another honor I was awarded by my MGVR racers was to receive the Collier Cup in 2004. This happens by votes from the other racers. In 2004, we had 136 MGs racing in the CC race. Joe Tierno, Al Costich and Ted Hershey have also been awarded the Collier Cup.



# The Other Elva Courier Fastback

You may recall my previous Spokes article (July, 2020) about my red Elva Courier Fastback MK4 (number E1115) that I purchased in February, 2019. We had transferred that car at the Watkins Glen racing museum talk about MGs racing on that cold winter day, and everyone got to see this unusual car and its restoration needs....

This story is about my *other* Elva Courier fastback coupe, purchased in June, 2021. This one practically found me. Since purchasing the red one, I had struck up a friendship with Elva Courier registrar Gary Cossaboon and we had been comparing notes on which of the 27 fastbacks produced still survived. There was an entry for a Pittsburgh, PA car from the 1970s that had gone cold on the Registry.

### **Purchase:**

I happened to be on the Elva club website one evening in May, 2021 when the screen refreshed and an ad appeared – posted by the Elva website owner (not Gary) for a Courier MK4 fastback in PA that was all apart. From the description it was clearly the Pittsburgh car. I replied to the website owner immediately –I do not think 45 total seconds elapsed, and he then wrote back sharing the owner contact details and stating that he would hold any further enquiries until I had contacted the owners and made a decision to buy or not.

A whirlwind single day trip to the outskirts of Pittsburgh confirmed this car was very original but also fully, fully dissembled. Thankfully(!), the engine, gearbox, suspension, chassis, and interior were all stored in his nice dry garage. The body had been cut off the chassis (more on this later) and stored in a shed in the back yard where the shed roof later failed, so that rain, snow, and large quantities of pine needles gathered on the fiberglass body. I agreed to purchase the car, since even as dissembled, it is better than the red car. So now I owned 2 of the 27 fastback Couriers ever made. It has been suggested I am trying to corner the market on them, but not true!

### **History:**

Benedict Sauka had purchased this car in the Pittsburgh area around 1970. Registry information shared by Gary Cossaboon had indicated it had been supplied new in early summer 1964 by Carl Haas (yes, the Indy Carl Haas) who ran a specialist/racing car dealership in Chicago in the 1960s. There is no ownership information available 1964-70. Benedict



drove the car summers and often attended SCCA races and crewed for other Courier racers but apparently never raced this coupe. As delivered, this LHD car (E1149) was a deep royal blue with camel interior and silver painted MGB wire wheels. The plan is to restore it in these colors again.

According to his widow Virginia and daughter Kim, Benedict enjoyed the car for about 18 years when it was showing signs of deterioration. He decided to undertake a full restoration. By that time his friend and Elva mentor RJ Weidman had moved to Norfolk, VA, so around 1988-89, Benedict took either the full car or major pieces to Norfolk to work on it. At some point, Benedict became alarmed about the rising costs of the restoration and decided to bring it back to work on it himself. He never made much more progress on it, and eventually he became ill and passed away in 2014.

I do not have any pictures of it yet during his ownership but am hopeful some will turn up.

### The Move:

The next question emerged: How to get it home?

The house and property were in the process of being sold, so we were on the clock to get it moved. I think there was something like 12 days left before closing. Huge thanks go to Mike Robinson, Ted Hershey, Al Costich, and my brother-in-law George Wallace for undertaking a 2-day trip to gather and bring home the car in pieces. I made a 3-page checklist of the entire car that we could check off as pieces were loaded. The trip included Ted's pick-up truck and trailer, and Mike's pick-up truck as well. We got to Murrysville,

PA outside Pittsburgh on a Thursday evening and early the next morning made our way to the rural location.

The chassis was easily moved to Ted's trailer by four of us. Next was time to move the body. We had to walk ahead of Ted's truck and trailer to make sure there were not any unwanted surprises in the longgrass field leading to the shed. Once there, the shed was clearly unstable with large windows rotted out of their frames above the door just waiting to fall on us.

Four of us quickly moved the body off the rotting boards in the dirt and out of the scary shed. I think Al Costich put the coffee cup on the roof while I paused to get a few pictures.

The rest of the loading process went well. It became

clear near the end of our loading process, that carbs and distributor for the original MGB engine were not there, nor the special kidney-shaped windows that go behind the doors on the car. By 11AM or noon, our 2-truck convoy was headed North and East. I think we unloaded by about 5PM at my storage unit, and I dragged myself home to collapse as it had been tiring and stressful, but successful trip!

One last item following the move: in the last 1-2 days before the house closed, daughter Km texted me that those special kidney shaped windows for behind the doors had been located stored in the basement rafters of the house. Several plans I had to get help to pick them up fell through. Eventually, Hollis and Doreena Hames came through and stopped in Murrysville on the way to a family celebration in Pittsburgh in Fall of 2023 and brought the parts home with my total gratitude.

### **Engine and Chassis work:**

I recounted the story of the engine rebuild (Spokes, August, 2023), completed by George Haynes and myself in 2022-23 with Frank Hutchinson doing all the machine work. It had showed promising signs of being rebuilt, but once we got inside the engine, we were glad we re-did it.

I had mentioned that Benedict had removed the body from the chassis. The chassis has a strong center 'spine' like a Lotus that carries most of the loads. But there were also a pair of chassis members that ran lengthwise under the sills/doors. A brief look at the chassis showed that these had been cut off, and worse, were nowhere to be found in the Murrysville garage or shed! This was going to be a challenge.

The next phase of this restoration occurred this past summer in the June-July timeframe. I had the opportunity to work with a skilled fabricator, Dave B in Webster to restore this chassis. Once again Mike Robinson came to the rescue and moved the chassis over to Dave's shop. Dave allowed me to work on and assist in all aspects of this project. We started with 3 new sheets of 4' x 8' sheet metal and systematically turned them into parts for the two chassis.

It quickly became clear that despite my online correspondence with other Courier MK4 owners here in the US and UK, that we simply did not have enough dimensions to re-make and weld in all the components and features with certainty. So, we got the red Elva out of my storage unit and put it on Dave's lift to serve as an ongoing exact reference throughout the entire project.

We cut the pieces with precision on his shear; bent them on the brake; spot welded them together; measured alignment and locations and features; put the floorboard 'suage lines' in with the bead roller; recreated end caps, stiffener pieces and outriggers. We clamped and aligned the components and Dave carefully welded each into place. We also made a second set of all the parts as we went, to be used on the red car another time.

The red car has proven to be a magnificent dimensional and feature model for this project. I really think it needs to stay in this role (i.e. keep it together for now) so I know where and how to run brake lines, fuel lines, install the suspension, etc. Then, eventually it will get its turn at restoration.

After about 3 weeks of rewarding work, the last features of this E1149 chassis were done. I cannot thank Dave B enough for sharing his time, shop, expertise, and enthusiasm to help restore this chassis. The repaired chassis next went to Miller Sandblasting off Lexington Ave for sandblasting, primer, and final paint with their satin black chassis paint. The resulting

completed chassis looks phenomenal – it is a shame to hide it under the body where no one will see it.

The next step is to start to reassemble the suspension on 4 corners and return this chassis to being a 'roller'. Again Benedict did me a nice favor and removed the 4 corners fully intact—he simply unbolted them at the chassis mounts, so each of the 4 corners is fully complete. Others in the Elva community have researched exactly which bushings, and shocks and spring rates set up that fascinating Elva MK4 Tru-Track fully independent rear suspension.

After that, the last big hurdle on this restoration will be the fiberglass bodywork and paint.

This project has been made very enjoyable through the sharing and collaboration of the Elva Registrar Gary, technical experts work on the car such as George, Frank, and Dave B, and the great assistance from club members including Mike, Ted, Al, and Hollis and Doreena. Thank you all.


