2025 MGCC Valve Cover Race Report - by George Heissenberger

The MG Car Club Western NY Centre held its annual running of the Valve Cover Races, Sunday

March 23, 2025 at Bushman's Cabin, Henrietta Veterans Memorial Park. 24 members and guests attended and there were 14 valve cover racers entered in two groups, seven small bore and seven large bore. Small bore is for cars with wheelbase the length of the typical four-cylinder British valve cover, and large bore is for cars with extended wheelbase/ chassis beyond the valve cover itself or larger valve covers such as six cylinder or V-8 valve covers. We also introduced a new visitor class for cars beyond our normal weight or length limits such as members of the Rochester Street Rods who attend our races.

As always, we had a delightful selection of appetizers, and desserts brought by members and guests so there was plenty of food to go around. After allowing time for everyone to fill their plates and glasses, there was a brief

reminder of the rules of double elimination bracket racing before the races began at 12:40 pm.

We alternated between small bore and large bore entrants and racing heated up. The rule of the day was it was better to go slow and straight then fast and veer off the track. Joe B. had one of the best runs by repeatedly winning over his opponents not by speed, but by staying straight and steady to win his heat. Ken Barlow found that he ran faster after removing the tires on his borrowed race car. Alec Briggs had a number of good runs as did Bud Briggs, but it wouldn't always go straight. That was the saying all day, better straight than off the track! There were a number of collisions in various heats and as they say in Nascar, if you aren't trading paint, you aren't racing!

Mike Robinson entered his Black Flame dragster and it

was a beauty. Carl Evert from the Rochester Street Rods entered his locomotive racer and wowed the fans with real train sounds from his car during his runs. Kyle Brown ran his Military special and won several heats as it ran straight. Bill Baldwin and Hollis Haymes cars were, as always, the ones to beat and it was no surprise when they came head to head after repeated wins. Bill came out on top in first place large bore, with Hollis Haymes second, and Mike Robinson third.

In the small bore class, Ethan Heissenberger ran with Betty Langswager's former race car and after winning a few heats proclaimed he had the best race car in the world. But it was not to last, and slow and steady Joe B, gradually picked off other cars who veered off course. Jim Herschell brought Gil Langswager to the races and ran Gil's former race car. Gil attended and was pleased to see their former race cars put to good use with new owners.

Mike Wagner's car went off track and hit a table leg, breaking off one of the front wheels, but he soldiered

After the races, time was allowed for everyone to vote on People's choice award for their favorite car and after the votes were counted it was a tie between Visitors Kyle Brown's Military special and Carl Evert's Locomotive train!

Once again, fun was the order of the day and this was one of the most fun times you can have without your actual car. I heard several people say this was such a fun event, they can't wait to be back next year, also several people said they were going to make a valve cover racer for next year, so let's see the new racers and see you next year!





Our MGB story began in the mid 1970's when in search of a sports car, I scoured the classified ads for a decent, inexpensive sports car. I checked out Sprites and Midgets, MGA's and MGB's. Just before my High school graduation June 1976, I found a Blaze 1971 MGB for \$1500. It had been repainted and had signs of previous rust repair with bondo and holes in the floor. It had studded snow tires on rusty wire wheels, so it was driven in the winter. It had a lot of chassis flex. I named it the Flexible Flyer. Once, I managed to drill through the fuel line under the floor while patching the floors with license plates, sending a geyser of fuel up in the air. Another time I hit a big pothole while the top was up and the chassis flexed so much it broke the passenger's side

windshield header clamp. After a few years, the sag got so bad you had to lift up when you closed the doors so they wouldn't hit on the top of the door jamb. Still it was a fun car and we had many fun times in it. I joined the MG car club at the Victor car show attending with this MG.

Then I met this marvelous girl Peggi at the Webster Fireman's carnival, and she liked sports cars too! While dating, we found her a 1967 Datsun 1600 roadster that was in really great condition. A southern car so no rust at all, at a decent price from a family I knew from school. So, she bought it! One thing she didn't like was the front hood and hood scoop shape and said it reminded her of a bread box, so she called it the bread box from then on!





A couple of years later Peggi and I were married. We had two sports cars and two regular cars, but we were moving into an apartment complex with no garage. Storage for the sports cars year-round was too expensive. Since the Datsun was in such good shape and the MGB was going to need lots of work we decided to sell the MGB and kept the Datsun. We even got a paint job for the Datsun and it looked great! The Datsun was reliable, but drove like a buckboard, not as smooth as an MG. We took that Datsun to MG club events, car shows and rallies for several years, even driving it to Niagara on the Lake Canada a couple of times with the club. We enjoyed the Datsun for several years.



Fast forward a few years and by 1984 we had our own house and a one car garage with three cars! What to do? Get another sports car! We missed the MGB. The Datsun had blown a head gasket and although we got it fixed, parts were getting harder to find. Plus the Datsun, nice as it was, always lacked the charm and driving feel of an MG. Club member George Haynes announced he was selling a couple of MGBs including a Glacier White 1973 MGB, that had some rust and needed some TLC. I had always been partial to 1973 MGBs with chrome bumpers, black grille, low ride height, nice dash gauges, glove box and center console, plus dual SU carbs and a big valve engine. \$1500 or so later we owned OUR MG! I did a complete tune up and carb adjustment and it ran well. It had a leaky heater core but I decided to put that off as I heard it was a PITA to replace. There was some body rust in the sills, but the floors were good, so I ordered new inner and outer sills and parts, lower sheet metal and everything else metal needed to replace the rusty bodywork plus a new gas tank and sender. I won't bore you with the long list of all the things I replaced or rebuilt over the years, but it's been a lot, and I have a folder full of receipts! D&M super finish did the metal work and I had the paint done by "Skip", one of my advertising clients in Webster. I also moved the SEV Marchall driving lights from the Datsun to the MGB.

We kept both sports cars for a year or so. One always had to be in the rain or snow. Besides, our daily drivers stayed outside. Eventually it became impractical with our limited space and budget to own two sports cars. So, we sold the Datsun and kept the MGB. Because we no longer had "his" and "hers" sports cars we deemed the MGB "Our" car. We ordered a custom license plate from the DMV "OUR MG" and have had it ever since.



So began a long and fun time of car shows, autocrossing, rallies, club events and generally fun times with OUR MG. Plus numerous rallies with Halloween being a big one every year. We used to autocross at Xerox, BOCES and MCC. The MG club had an enclosed trailer with cones and equipment and was quite active with Autocrosses at one time.

When the kids were little, before car seats were mandated, we sat them on the back package tray of the MGB and put a leather belt around them and the seat belt attachments on the center hump. It may not have kept them seated in a crash, but it would have slowed their trajectory. The club had a lot of young members then and did some kids events like a trip to the zoo, which I took my daughter to in the MG and remember it rained the whole trip.







We taught both our kids how to drive and shift in OUR MG and once getting their licenses, each then took it out alone for their first "solo". When our son was in High school, we had an exchange student from Germany named "Till" staying with us. In getting out some lawn chair cushions from the loft in our garage, I accidently dislodged a metal fertilizer spreader that was in the loft, and it fell with a crash on the hood of the MG. I sure taught Till some new words in English! Oh well, insurance covered the hood repairs and after a repaint from a shop in Ontario NY it was as good as new. It has had one more repaint since then. Other than paint, I tend to do my own work on the car unless it needs a machine shop or special expertise. My kids helped too with routine maintenence jobs so they know the basics. My son Glenn worked for a summer at British Auto and went on to be an auto mechanic after graduating from the GM ASEP Auto program at MCC.



One of my frequent cruise nights was always the Log Cabin in Macedon. I could be found there most Wednesdays after work and frequently parked next to fellow club member Rod Rodman.

All went well for many years, until one time. I was waiting at the stop sign on West Walworth Road to cross Rt 31F by the Log cabin, when some kids in a Pontiac ran the stop sign and hit a pizza delivery car broadside. I stopped and could not get out of the way. Both cars slid right into the front of OUR MG, with a crash. The crash broke the steering rack sending both wheels pointed in different directions, bent the front left wheel , cracked the brake rotor and crumpled the fender. Me and a buddy were unhurt, but the car needed significant repair. But its just metal after all and can be replaced. Hagerty insurance was great and Austin Spencer collision did the paint mechanical and metal repair and made the



MGB good as new! Mark Voelkers advised them on some of the mechanical fixes like the steering rack, etc.

Besides lots and lots of local cruise nights and car shows we've driven OUR MG many places, including Canada. I usually go every year to the Watkins Glen Gran Prix vintage festival too.

These days you'll find us at local cruise nights, car shows, cars and coffee, and sometimes I meet my son and his 1975 Dodge Dart to park together Thursdays at Wegmans.



I had a Parish hardtop for OUR MG at one time, but after a few years I decided I didn't need it so I sold it. I soon regretted not having a hard top so looked for another one. Fellow club member Jeff Kath had a

factory hardtop and sold it to me. Jeff included new plexiglass side windows. It needed paint and had some cracks in the fiberglass, so I prepped it and had a friend do the paint and finish to match the Glacier white of the car. I got new seals from Macgregor in Canada, but didn't replace the side windows as the screws holding the side frames were siezed, so that's a future project. For now I polished the plexiglass with a headlight cleaning kit.

We're happy with the result and feel it really transforms the car into a cozy coupe when installed. Warmer, quieter, more secure. You really have to drive it to feel the difference. We like the look!









One of the things about having a car long enough besides the memories, is we can try to recreate old photos. Here are a couple we did to show the march of time!

I had been telling myself that when I got around 100,000 miles I should get the engine rebuilt, but after burning a valve around 2007, I had Mark at British Auto rebuild the head and put off doing the rest of the engine for a few years. But by 2014, I needed a new clutch as it was slipping, so we had the car taken to The Wire Wheel on Clinton Avenue to have the engine rebuilt and the clutch replaced.

Everything in the engine was replaced except the block and connecting rods. The head just needed a light refreshing since it had been recently gone over, but the valve train was all new. The HIF carbs were refreshed too. New Borg and Beck clutch. It's like a new lease on life for the old girl. I had flat top pistons installed so it's a bit higher compression than stock. Drake engines did the engine work and Wire Wheel did the engine removal, installation, clutch and pressure plate and setup after install. She runs great!






Hopefully we will be driving for many years to come! We all get older but the car goes on and on. As long as we can get in and out of it OK, we'll keep driving OUR MG.








Al Wagner's 1967 MGB GT

On my way into work on a Monday morning, I stopped in the lobby of the plant to pick up a copy of the weekly company newsletter (this was 1978 so everything was still paper). This was a special seven page marketplace edition. At my morning break, I sat down with my coffee to pour through all of the wanted and for sale adds. To my surprise on the bottom of page four, I found this:




With luck, the seller worked in the same building so I gave him a quick call to get additional information on the car. The car actually belonged to his wife (the original owner) but, with a growing family, she was looking for more practical transportation. We talked a bit about the MG as to condition and such and set up a day at lunch, I looked the car over and drove it around the parking lot. At that point, I was convinced that I would pay the asking price and set up a time after work to seal the deal.





It was great having an MG again so I started using It as my daily driver. I had sold my first MG when my family grew so I understood what the first owner was going through. We used the car for going back and forth to work and on weekend trips to the beach or mountains. My son was still small enough to fit in the back seat which made it great car for us.

A few months later, a chance for a transfer to Rochester came through so it was time for the MG to make a run on I-90 to its new home. The new job included a company car so I sold my Camaro and the MG finally got to reside in a garage for the first time in its life. We still did weekend drives but the usage was much less because of the demands of my job.



Since I lived close to Victor, I droved the MG to the "Sports Car and Vintage Auto Festival" that June but did not enter it. I met members of the local MG Car Club and was invited to join. It took me a few years to get involved but I eventually joined the club and started doing events with them.

Over the years, we have done numerous events with the car and even several New England trips with club members. There have been some interesting breakdowns over the years (fuel pumps changed on the side of the road and in a parking lot along with a bad generator in Vermont) but the MG is still going. even taught both my son and grandson to drive a standard in it. This past summer, the odometer just rolled over the 100,000 mile mark and it still has the original clutch! There has been no major restoration done over the 48 years I have owned it so, next winter, my grandson wants to pull the engine and rework the whole drive train. After all, he is going to be the next owner when I give it up. But that will not be for a looong time!






