
Sorry I didn't get any photos at the winery.

In the November, 2020 issue of *Spokes*, I told the story of my first MGB. In fact the editor at the time, Mike Goodwin, even put the only photo I have of that car on the cover.



MG version one was a 1965 roadster, painted iris blue with a darker blue top and black leather seats. I was 19 years old when I bought it for \$100 and never anticipated the purchase would start me on a path of MG ownership which continues more than half a century later. It was appropriate that I'd acquired my first MG at such a young age. Since I was a college student, with little

money, I had to learn to repair it myself. Those skills were to serve me well in later years, though I didn't realize it at the time.

For a dozen years after the roadster met its untimely end, I drove other cars. In March 1985 my wife became concerned about the frequent breakdowns of this Audi we had and the ramifications of being stranded on the side of the road with two toddlers. This was long before the internet was developed so I started looking in the want ads for a replacement second vehicle. I hit the jackpot on the first scan of the ads: a 1971 MGB GT for sale in Spencerport.

This did not strike her as a worthy replacement for an unreliable Audi but I reasoned she could drive our brand new Chrysler and I'd drive the MG in the good weather and then get a beater for the winter.

I was aware there was an MG Car Club in Rochester but had no idea how to contact them. I called the Rochester Public Library and they gave me a phone number for George Herschell, who told me he'd spotted me driving the GT around Webster. Membership in MGCC opened up a whole new world. I met like-minded sports car enthusiasts, got tech tips, awareness of parts and service sources and, best of all, activities. In those days the club had more driving events such as gymkhanas, timedistance road rallies and runs to out of town events. The crowning event for the MGCC each year was the car show, known informally as the Victor Car Show. It was a lot of fun and a lot of work. Usually we had around 1,000 cars on the field and up to 10,000 spectators!

Another highlight of the driving season was, and still is, the Vintage Race weekend at Watkins Glen. It was at that event in '86 that I had the GT on the track for laps. Some of

us held way back at the end of the parade and were able to achieve decent speeds once we "hit it." The track is more strict about that stuff now, regrettably.

The GT was in very good shape for a 99,000 mile car. The seller was retiring to Texas and gave me receipts showing he had put more money into it than he got in selling it. The body had recently been painted new racing green, a change from the original blaze orange, but still, an official 1971 color. The only immediate attention required was proper tuning and I sorted that out pretty quickly. I added a seat belt to the so-called "seat" over the battery cover and my little son and daughter enjoyed riding back there. If I tried that today, I'd be arrested, but these were simpler times!



Looking back at the maintenance logbook I see I did a lot of tinkering with the GT in those early years. Not long after I got it, the starter conked out. Then the rebuilt starter I installed failed so I got a free replacement. I added a stainless steel Falcon exhaust system which served me well until it was

replaced in 2021 with a Bell exhaust I'd purchased from Abington Spares.

Extensive front suspension work was was performed in 1986. The head was rebuilt sometime around 1988 by T&G Speed, which had been recommended by my friend Bob Tescione. And on and on with the repairs, maintenance and improvements. The maintenance log has grown very fat after 40 years!

As winter approached, thoughts always turned to putting the MG into storage. For several years, Steve Fitch and I rented a detached garage from an elderly lady in Lincoln. We could just squeeze his RHD TD and my GT into the little space and it didn't cost much for rent. Then Steve ditched the TD and bought a 911 but that too fit the space. Sadly, both the lady and Steve passed away so my GT then spent winters in my uncle's new barn in Walworth.

Over this past winter my GT received extensive beauty treatment at EM Motors. This involved new sheet metal to repair a few rusty spots and multiple coats of new racing green paint. In addition, the seats were re-upholstered with new foams and

webbing and original-replica seat covering bought from Midland Sports & Classics Ltd. Once again it looks just as newish and shiny as it did on delivery day in March, 1985.



Over the 40 years (and counting) of owning the GT and maintaining membership in MGCC-WNY I have made many lasting friendships and had mountains of fun. Even all the work I've done on the car has been (mostly) fun though and even therapeutic. My intent is to keep this car until I can no longer get in and out of it. I hope that doesn't happen for a long, long time.





Pre-game on 1200 mg acetaminophen

Bring a few differential drain plug sockets or switch to Allen head sockets for them before you need it to save Miguel from grinding down yet another 1/2" socket adapter.
